PRELIMINARY DRAFT - NOT READY FOR INTRODUCTION

AN ACT to amend 119.04 (1); and to create 115.28 (17m) and 120.12 (29) of the statutes; relating to: materials related to a school board's obligations to provide instruction on American Indians.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

This bill requires the Department of Public Instruction to develop materials that inform school board members, school district administrators, and school principals of the school board's obligations to provide certain instruction related to American Indians. Under the bill, DPI must provide these materials to school boards and publish the materials on DPI's website. Finally, under the bill, school boards must provide these materials to school board members within 30 days of taking office, to school district administrators, and to school principals.

Under current law, a school board must provide to pupils the following:

- 1. An instructional program designed to give pupils an understanding of human relations, particularly with regard to American Indians, Black Americans, and Hispanics.
- 2. Instruction in the history, culture, and tribal sovereignty of the federally recognized American Indian tribes and bands located in this state at least twice in grades kindergarten to eight and at least once in grades 9 to 12.

 - 2. At least twice in the elementary grades and at least once in the high school grades, instruction in the history, culture, and tribal sovereignty of the federally recognized American Indian tribes and bands located in this state, as required under s. 121.02 (1) (L) 4.
 - (b) Provide the materials developed under par. (a) to school boards and publish the materials developed under par. (a) on the department's Internet site.

Section 2. 119.04 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

Section 3. 120.12 (29) of the statutes is created to read:

120.12 (29) American Indian instruction; informational materials. Provide the materials developed under s. 115.28 (17m) to school board members, school district administrators, and principals. The school board shall provide the materials to a school board member no later than 30 days after the school board member takes office.

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL NOTE: The bill draft currently requires that a school board provide the materials developed by the Department of Public Instruction to a school board member no later than 30 days after the school board member takes office. The bill draft does not currently provide a deadline or frequency for providing the same materials to school district administrators and principals. Does this deadline for material distribution to school board members satisfy the committee's intent? Would the committee like to provide a similar deadline or prescribe a frequency for the provision of such materials to school district administrators and principals?

LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL NOTE: The bill draft currently does not specify a date by which the Department of Public Instruction must develop or post the materials to its website, nor does it specify a school year by which school boards must begin providing the materials to board members, school district administrators, and principals. Would the committee like to require that the Department of Public Instruction develop and post the materials to its website by a particular date? Would the committee like to require that school boards begin distributing the materials by a particular date or beginning with a particular school year?

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
