### **2019 BILL**

1	AN ACT to amend 119.04 (1); and to create 115.28 (17m) and 120.12 (29) of the
2	statutes; relating to: materials related to a school board's obligations to
3	provide instruction on American Indians.

# The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

JOINT LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL PREFATORY NOTE: This bill was prepared for the Joint Legislative Council's Special Committee on State-Tribal Relations.

Current law requires that a school board provide pupils with the following:

- 1. An instructional program that is designed to give pupils at all grade levels an understanding of human relations, particularly with regard to American Indians, Black Americans, and Hispanics.
- 2. As part of the social studies curriculum, instruction in the history, culture, and tribal sovereignty of the federally recognized American Indian tribes and bands located in Wisconsin at least twice in the elementary grades and at least once in the high school grades.

The bill requires that the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) develop materials to inform school board members, school district administrators, and principals

of the requirements described above. The materials must be developed, initially provided to school boards, and posted on DPI's website by September 1 of the school year beginning after the bill takes effect. DPI must update the materials in response to any changes to a school board's obligation to provide instruction related to American Indians and must inform school boards of any such updates.

The bill also requires that school boards provide the informational materials to school board members, school district administrators, and principals. School boards must provide the materials to school board members within 30 days after the school board member takes office; to a school district administrator or principal within 30 days after the person accepts that position; and to all school board members, school district administrators, and principals within 30 days after receiving updated materials from DPI.

**Section 1.** 115.28 (17m) of the statutes is created to read:

- 115.28 (17m) American Indian instruction; informational materials. (a) Develop materials to inform school board members, school district administrators, and principals of the school board's obligation to provide instruction related to American Indians, including all of the following:
- 1. An instructional program designed to give pupils an understanding of human relations, particularly with regard to American Indians, as required under s. 118.01 (2) (c) 8.
- 2. At least twice in the elementary grades and at least once in the high school grades, instruction in the history, culture, and tribal sovereignty of the federally recognized American Indian tribes and bands located in this state, as required under s. 121.02 (1) (L) 4.
- (b) Update the materials under par. (a) as necessary to accurately reflect a school board's obligation to provide instruction related to American Indians.
- (c) Within 30 days of developing materials under par. (a) and each time the materials are updated under par. (b), do all of the following:
  - 1. Provide the materials or updated materials to school boards.
- 18 2. Publish the materials or updated materials on the department's Internet site.

**Section 2.** 119.04 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

119.04 (1) Subchapters IV, V and VII of ch. 115, ch. 121 and ss. 66.0235 (3) (c), 66.0603 (1m) to (3), 115.01 (1) and (2), 115.28, 115.31, 115.33, 115.34, 115.343, 115.345, 115.363, 115.364, 115.365 (3), 115.367, 115.38 (2), 115.415, 115.445, 118.001 to 118.04, 118.045, 118.06, 118.07, 118.075, 118.076, 118.10, 118.12, 118.125 to 118.14, 118.145 (4), 118.15, 118.153, 118.16, 118.162, 118.163, 118.164, 118.18, 118.19, 118.196, 118.20, 118.223, 118.225, 118.24 (1), (2) (c) to (f), (6), (8), and (10), 118.245, 118.25, 118.255, 118.258, 118.291, 118.292, 118.293, 118.30 to 118.43, 118.46, 118.50, 118.51, 118.52, 118.53, 118.55, 118.56, 120.12 (2m), (4m), (5), and (15) to (27), and (29), 120.125, 120.13 (1), (2) (b) to (g), (3), (14), (17) to (19), (26), (34), (35), (37), (37m), and (38), 120.137, 120.14, 120.20, 120.21 (3), and 120.25 are applicable to a 1st class city school district and board but not, unless explicitly provided in this chapter or in the terms of a contract, to the commissioner or to any school transferred to an opportunity schools and partnership program.

**Section 3.** 120.12 (29) of the statutes is created to read:

120.12 **(29)** American Indian instruction; informational materials. (a) Provide the materials under s. 115.28 (17m) (a) to a school board member by no later than 30 days after the school board member takes office and to a school district administrator or principal by no later than 30 days after the individual accepts the position as a school district administrator or principal.

(b) If the school board receives updated materials under s. 115.28 (17m) (c) 1., provide the updated materials to school board members, school district administrators, and principals by no later than 30 days after the school board receives the updated materials.

### **SECTION 4. Nonstatutory provisions.**

(1) Initial materials; Deadline. The state superintendent of public instruction shall develop the materials under s. 115.28 (17m) (a) and publish the materials on the department of public instruction's Internet site, as required under s. 115.28 (17m) (c) 2., by no later than September 1 of the school year beginning after the effective date of this subsection.

### **SECTION 5. Initial applicability.**

(1) Materials to school board members, school administrators, and Principals. The treatment of s. 120.12 (29) (a) first applies to school board members who take office on September 1 of the school year beginning after the effective date of this subsection and to individuals who accept a position as a school administrator or a principal on September 1 of the school year beginning after the effective date of this subsection.
