PRELIMINARY DRAFT - NOT READY FOR INTRODUCTION

AN ACT to amend 323.14 (1) (a) 2. of the statutes; relating to: encouraging county boards to designate a full-time head of emergency management (suggested as remedial legislation by the Department of Military Affairs).

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, each county board is required to designate a head of emergency management. This bill encourages the county board to make the head of emergency management a full-time position.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Law Revision Committee prefatory note: This bill is a remedial legislation proposal, requested by the Department of Military Affairs and introduced by the Law Revision Committee under s. 13.83 (1) (c) 4. and 5., stats. After careful consideration of the various provisions of the bill, the Law Revision Committee has determined that this bill makes minor substantive changes in the statutes, and that these changes are desirable as a matter of public policy.

- **Section 1.** 323.14 (1) (a) 2. of the statutes is amended to read:
- 5 323.14 (1) (a) 2. Each county board shall designate a head of emergency
- 6 management, and each county board is encouraged to make the head of emergency
