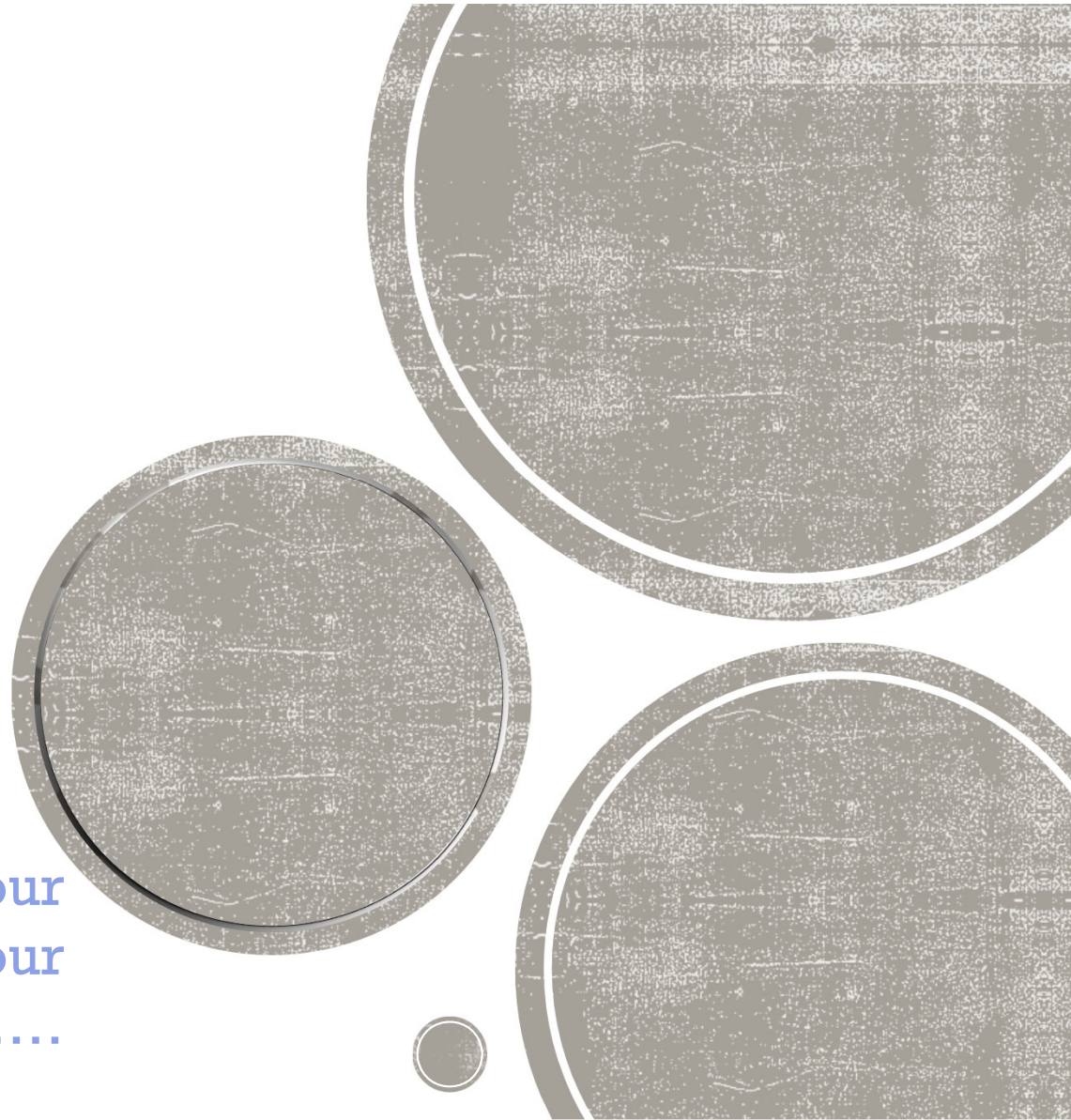


Approximately 95% of those

released.....



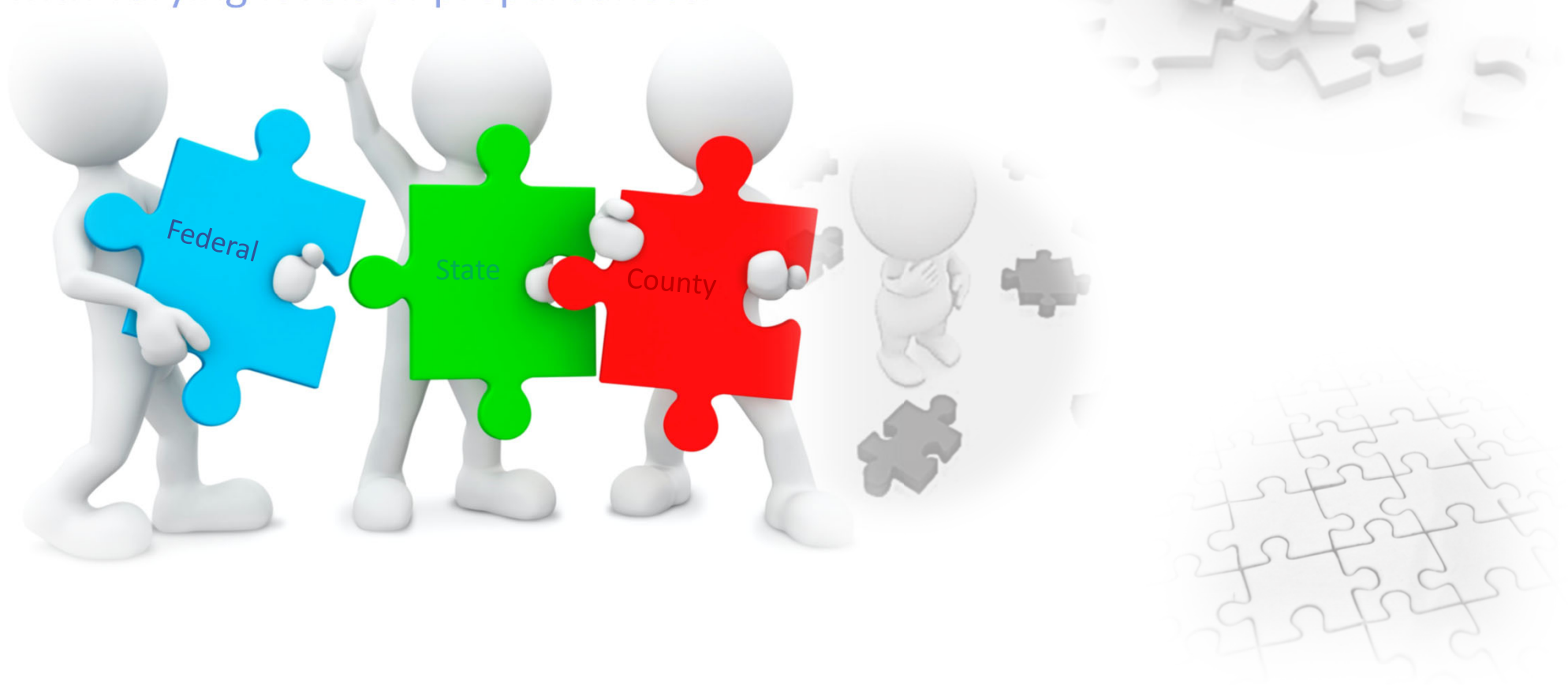
....might be your neighbor, your

like for those being released.....

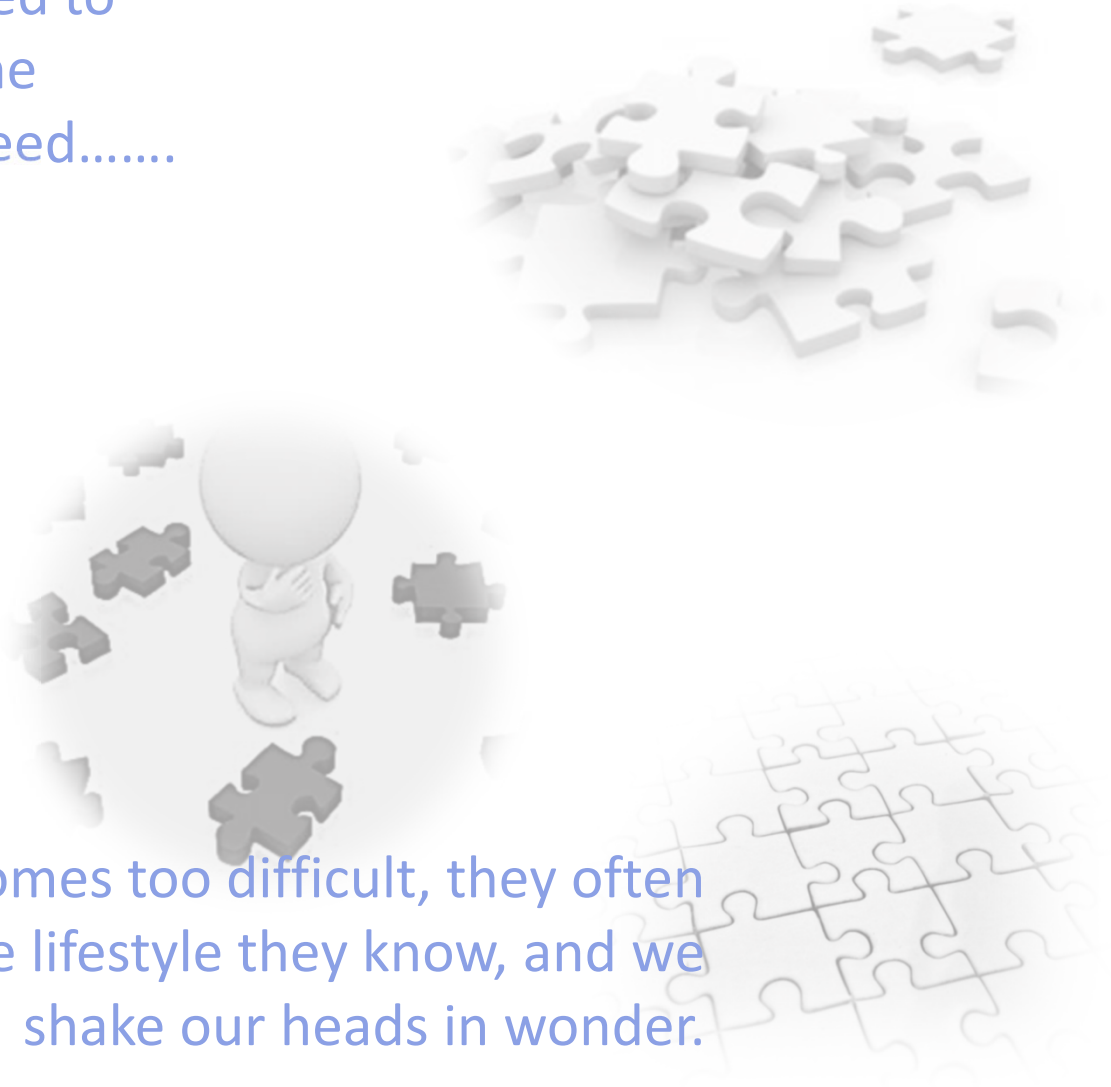




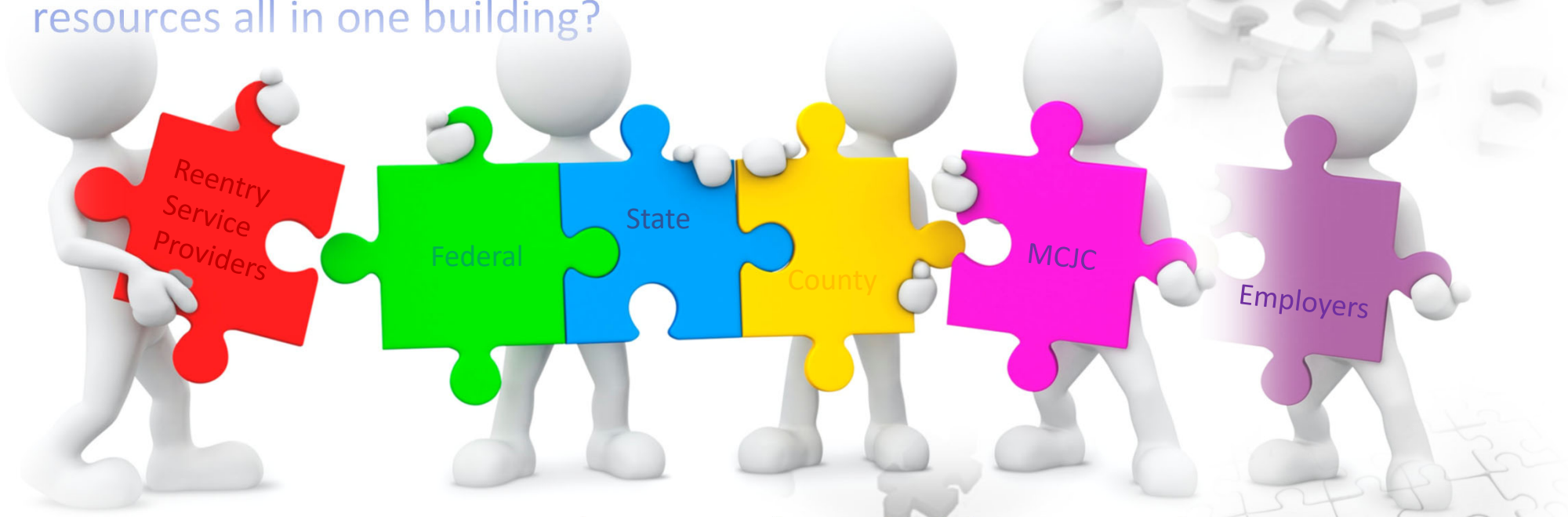
We are *expecting* those just released to juggle their life as well as find all the reentry services they need to succeed.....




....when it becomes too difficult, they often go back to the lifestyle they know, and we shake our heads in wonder.

## **SOCIAL WORKER/MENTAL HEALTH EXPERT**

- An initial assessment needs to be conducted to best identify reentry needs.

### **IDENTIFICATION**

- A returning citizen will need their Birth certificate, Social Security card, State ID, and driver's license if eligible. This office will be able to provide forms and direction to obtain these items.

### **FINANCES**

- A returning citizen will need to create a bank account for direct deposit. We will partner with financial institutions that do not require a fee to set this account up and we will provide them with a debit card prior to leaving.

### **HOUSING**

- A returning citizen will need to have access to emergency housing options if they are homeless, and landlords that rent to the formerly incarcerated.

### **HEALTHCARE**

- A returning citizen will need access to affordable healthcare. We will sign them up for the appropriate services.

### **REENTRY SERVICES**

- All returning citizens will have different needs upon reentry. They will be directed to organizations that can best help them with their needs.

### **EMPLOYMENT**

- All returning citizens will need to create an initial resume and be directed to employment agencies. If needed, digital resumes will be uploaded before they leave this office.

### **LEGAL**

- Many returning citizens have open legal proceedings; whether active cases, child support, fees, et cetera. We will organize and best direct next steps.

### **EDUCATION**

- All returning citizens will be given the information on how to proceed with their next level of education.

### **SUPERVISION AGENT**

- Most returning citizens will have a supervision agent. The DOC can station multiple 'reentry agents' here to facilitate the explanation and signing of their rules.
