SUBJECT: Senate Bill 895/Assembly Bill 921: Building Projects for UW System

SB 895 and AB 921, hereafter referred to as "the bill," are companion bills that would enumerate a number of building projects for the University of Wisconsin System. SB 895 and AB 921 were introduced on January 10, 2024, and referred to the Joint Committee on Finance. The Committee held a public hearing on the bills on January 11, 2024. Assembly Amendment 1 (AA 1) and Senate Amendment 1 (SA 1) were introduced on February 5, 2024.

SUMMARY OF BILL

Under the bill, five UW System projects would be enumerated as part of the 2023-25 state building program. These projects, and their respective funding sources, are outlined in the table below. A description of each project is available on the Department of Administration's website, within the document titled 2023-25 Capital Budget Agency Requests and Governor's Recommendations.

The bill would transfer \$423,273,000 from the general fund to the capital improvement fund during the 2023-25 biennium to fund the projects that would be enumerated under this bill. It would amend the Building Commission segregated revenue continuing appropriation created under 2023 Act 19 (the 2023-25 budget) to also designate these funds as "segregated revenue" and to authorize the expenditure of such funds for projects enumerated under the bill.

The bill would provide \$110,219,000 of new PR-supported general obligation bonding authority and would increase the UW System - self-amortizing facilities bonding authorization accordingly.

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENT

Under current law, no structures, other than memorials approved by the Board of Veterans Affairs, and no walks, roads, or subterranean footing may be placed or erected upon Camp Randall Memorial Park, unless authorized by the Legislature. Current law also states that the Park may not be used for any purpose other than a memorial park. AA 1 and SA 1 would modify 2023 Act 19 (where the project was enumerated and funded) to specify that the Legislature authorizes the construction of the Camp Randall Sports Center Replacement Facility, which could affect the Camp Randall Memorial Park. In addition, the amendments would specify that the use of any part of the facility that overlaps with the boundaries of the Park is not limited to use as a memorial park.

AA 1 and SA 1 would also create a nonstatutory provision requiring the Board of Regents of the UW System to submit to the Board of Veterans Affairs, no later than June 30, 2024, a plan to honor the veterans of this state.

FISCAL EFFECT

After consideration of the proposed transfer of \$423,273,000 from the general fund to the capital improvement fund, the projected net balance in the general fund at the end of the 2023-25 biennium would be \$3,151,992,600. The bill would also authorize \$110,219,000 of program revenue supported borrowing for two of the five projects.

In 2023 Act 19, the 2023-25 building program included projects with a total enumeration of \$1,997,866,200 from all sources of funding. The bill would enumerate an additional \$696,705,000, so that the 2023-25 building program (under Act 19 as amended by the bill) would total \$2,694,571,200. As part of the funding for the building program, Act 19 transfers \$1,234,081,900 from the general fund to the capital improvement fund in the 2023-25 biennium. This bill would increase that transfer by \$423,273,000, for a total transfer of \$1,657,354,900.
