Fire Suppression Grants (DNR -- Forestry and Parks)

[LFB 2009-11 Budget Summary: Page 453, #3 (part)]

CURRENT LAW

1997 Act 27 created a pilot program with \$525,000 annually to award grants for up to 50% of the costs of purchasing fire resistant clothing and fire suppression supplies, equipment and vehicles. DNR administers the program, currently referred to as the Forest Fire Protection program (FFP). Funds are available to cities, villages, towns, counties and fire suppression organizations that enter into a written agreement to assist DNR in the suppression of forest fires when requested. The program was authorized on a two-year demonstration basis with a June 30, 1999, sunset. The 1999-01 biennial budget deleted the sunset provision and allocated \$198,000 annually from the forestry account, with \$327,000 in federal funds to continue grant levels of \$525,000 annually. 2001 Act 16 expanded allowable uses of the grant to include fire prevention materials and fire suppression training and provided an additional \$250,000 annually, increasing funds available beginning in 2002-03 to \$775,000 (\$448,000 in forestry SEG and \$327,000 FED). Under chapter NR 47 of the administrative code, grant awards for fire departments range from a minimum of \$750 to a maximum of \$10,000, and grants to fire suppression organizations range from \$750 to \$25,000.

In 2008-09, \$775,000 was budgeted for the program (\$448,000 forestry SEG and \$327,000 FED). Additional federal funding became available, bringing the total amount available for forest fire protection grants in fiscal year 2008-09 to \$920,500 (\$448,000 forestry SEG and \$472,500 FED).

GOVERNOR

Delete conservation fund (forestry) SEG of \$448,000 annually for the fire suppression (forest fire protection) grant program.

DISCUSSION POINTS

1. The bill would eliminate state funding for the Forest Fire Protection program during 2009-11. However, statutory authority for the program would remain meaning funding for the program could then be provided in future budgets. The administration indicates that funding for the program was deleted as part of DNR's agency reduction plan. DOA argues that these reductions in forestry account expenditures are necessary to maintain a sufficient balance in the forestry account, due to uncertain timber harvest and forestry mill tax revenues.

2. Eliminating the forest fire protection grant program could result in increased expenditures from the state forestry general program operations appropriation. In order to receive a forest fire protection grant, fire departments and fire suppression organizations must have a written agreement with DNR to assist DNR in the suppression of wildland fires. Under these agreements, a fire department or fire suppression organization may elect the "cost" option, where they are reimbursed for their forest fire assistance, or "no cost" where they are not reimbursed. Reimbursement rates are currently set at \$50 per hour per fire truck used, and \$8.55 per hour per firefighter. A fire department, or a fire suppression organization, or DNR may revise the agreement at any time. Approximately 40% of fire departments/fire suppression organizations with agreements currently choose to be reimbursed. If a fire department or fire suppression organization does not choose reimbursement, they are given priority for forest fire protection grants if the Department is unable to fund all eligible funding requests. The Department anticipates that at least some of the 60% of fire departments/fire suppression organizations currently choosing the no cost option would choose the reimbursement option were state funding to be eliminated for the forest fire protection program.

3. Therefore, the bill could result in shifting some state forestry operations funds (such as related to state fire emergency LTEs, heavy equipment operation, or other state forest fire and pest suppression efforts) to pay for additional local forest fire response reimbursement under the cooperative agreements. Between calendar years 2000 and 2006, DNR spent an average of \$160,000 per year from the forestry account appropriation for general state forestry operations for fire suppression reimbursement (more recent data was unavailable). If all of the fire departments and fire suppression organizations were to choose reimbursement, DNR estimates that this number could rise to approximately \$390,000 per year. However, how many departments/organizations would choose this option would depend on the level of federal funding available (estimated at approximately \$500,000 each year) for the program, and whether the fire department/fire suppression organization perceived they were less likely to receive a grant given the loss of state funds.

4. DNR officials indicate that the deletion of segregated funding for the fire protection program would not affect the amount of federal funding available to Wisconsin under the program because the program requires local fire departments to match 50 percent of grant funds, which fulfills the federal matching requirement. Currently, federal funding is available for forest fire protection grants from two major federal grant programs, the Volunteer Fire Assistance (VFA) program and the State Fire Assistance program (SFA) program. The VFA program, formerly known as the Rural Community Fire Protection program, provides federal financial, technical and other

assistance in the organization, training, and equipping of fire departments in rural areas with a population of 10,000 or less. The SFA program assists state forestry agencies in wildfire response coordination and delivery, compliance with national safety and training standards, hazard assessments, fuel treatment projects and public education efforts. In state fiscal year 2009, these federal grant programs provided a total of \$472,500 for the Wisconsin fire protection program (\$263,400 VFA and \$209,100 SFA). Prior to 2008-09, DNR administered VFA grants to local fire departments as a separate grant program. Beginning in 2008-09, VFA grant dollars were redirected to the fire protection grant program. While \$448,000 SEG was available for the program in 2008-09, DNR chose to lapse \$75,000 from the SEG appropriation to the balance of the forestry account due to the inclusion of federal VFA dollars in the fire protection grant program.

5. According to the Department, Wisconsin may receive an increased amount of federal funding under the State Fire Assistance program in state fiscal year 2009-10. The exact amount that will be available to Wisconsin has not been determined but overall federal funding for this program could increase by as much as 15%. Given that DNR chose not to allot \$75,000 in state funding to the fire protection program in 2008-09, an alternative could be to restore state funding for the program at this lower level, perhaps \$375,000 annually (Alternative 4).

6. Further, Wisconsin could receive additional federal funding through the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009. Under the act, the U.S. Forest Service has been allocated \$1.15 billion. To date, 10% of this funding has been awarded to states (\$200,000 was awarded to Wisconsin for forest facility upgrades in Rhinelander) for projects related to construction and maintenance of facilities, roads, and trails, and abandoned mine mitigation, and for wildland fire management projects. It is unclear what portion of remaining funds would be awarded to states, and of that, what portion Wisconsin could expect to receive.

7. On the other hand, fire protection grant applications have generally exceeded available funds. In fiscal year 2008-09, DNR received requests from 286 eligible forest departments and fire suppression organizations (280 fire departments, six fire suppression organizations) for \$2,373,700 in fire protection funds. Using both state and federal funds, the Department made 266 awards, fully funding 173 of these and partially funding another 93 for a total funding award of \$879,700, leaving 20 unfunded (16 fire departments and four fire suppression associations). The attachment shows grants awarded under the program in 2008-09. Given the demand for fire protection grants, and an expected balance in the forestry account, the Committee could consider restoring some level of program funding.

8. Two options could be to provide at least \$525,000 in total grant funding (the level of funding originally provided under the program), or \$775,000, the base level of grant funding budgeted. If Wisconsin were to receive an increase of 15% in federal funding from the State Fire Assistance program (\$240,500), approximately \$504,000 in federal funding would be estimated to be received in fiscal year 2009-10. The Committee could consider providing \$21,000 in annual funding to provide \$525,000 annually (Alternative 2) or \$271,000 to provide total funding of \$775,000 annually for fire protection grants (Alternative 3).

9. Other alternatives could be considered. Under the bill, most appropriations were

reduced by 1%, while some were reduced by an additional 5% or more. Therefore, to be consistent with other program funding levels under the bill, the program could be funded at 94%, (\$421,100 annually under Alternative 5), 99% (\$443,500 annually under Alternative 6) or 100% (\$448,000 under Alternative 7).

ALTERNATIVES

1. Adopt the Governor's recommendation to delete \$448,000 annually related to forest fire protection grants.

2. Provide \$21,000 annually to reflect anticipated federal funding and restore the forest fire protection program at the original funding level (\$525,000 annually).
