Pursuant to s. 23.0917(6m)(a) and (dr), Wis. Stats., the Department is notifying you as co-chairs of the Committee on Joint Finance of a proposed grant of \$52,765 from the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program to Iron County for the Ofstad Trail acquisition. This is a request for approval to award 2022 fiscal year funds.

The Ofstad Trail acquisition is 100% productive forest land in the town of Oma. The project will secure permanent public recreation opportunities on an established motorized trail system, ensure continued future forest management and safeguard wildlife habitat on 79 acres connecting to 1,400 additional acres of Iron County Forest lands.

The County proposes no prohibitions of nature-based outdoor activities, as defined in s. 23.0916(1)(b), Wis. Stats.

As provided in s. 23.0917(6m)(a), Wis. Stats., if the Department does not receive notification of the scheduling of a hearing from either of the Joint Committee on Finance co-chairpersons within 14 working days from today, the Department will award this grant.

SUBJECT: Request for approval of a Knowles Nelson Stewardship grant award for land acquisition

north of Highway 64.

Pursuant to s. 23.0917(6m)(a) and (dr), Wis. Stats., the Department of Natural Resources is notifying you of a proposed Knowles-Nelson Stewardship grant in the amount of \$52,765.00 to Iron County for acquisition of a 79.26-acre property known as the Ofstad Trail tract. The Knowles-Nelson Stewardship program is funded under s. 20.866(2)(ta), Wis. Stats. This is a request for approval to award fiscal year 2022 funds.

PROJECT DETAILS:

Project Sponsor: Iron County

Grant sub-program: County Forest acquisition

Location: The land is in the Town of Oma, accessible via Palmquist Road

Project description: This 79.26-acre property is relatively flat and is a 100% productive forest. This property is contiguous to the west to 1400 acres of Iron County Forest. The property is dominated by northern hardwoods (52 acres) with the balance being mixed conifers (27 acres). There is .65 mile of interior woods road that connect a public road to an existing County Forest road system for timber production operations and recreational access.

A key segment of motorized trail crosses the subject property.

This acquisition had been identified by Iron County as a long-term investment for timber production, recreation and watershed protection.

This tract will be incorporated into the Stewardship and County Forest programs and managed according to the County's Forest Comprehensive Land Use Plan. Project area maps are attached as Appendix A.

Project benefits: County acquisition of this property will:

- Secure direct access from a town-maintained road to over 1,400 acres of County Forest lands. This
 parcel has historically provided access to the County lands via permission of private landowners.
 The eastern access point is important to both forest management efficiency and recreational uses.
 Prospective private buyers have inquired about closing public access: County acquisition will
 instead allow road and trail access to be constructed entirely on the public lands.
- Permanently secure a vital recreation corridor (5.4 miles) in a county for which tourism is the 2nd leading industry.
- Add ~80 acres of productive forest to County holdings: the next scheduled harvests will occur in 2033.

This project has full support from the Iron County Board, motorized recreational clubs in Iron County, the Hurley Chamber of Commerce, the Iron County Office of Economic Development and local businesses that benefit from the trail use on this parcel.



Public Uses: The parcel will be open to the public year-round for hunting, trapping, hiking, cross-country skiing, snowshoeing, biking, horseback riding and motorized recreation. The Department's analysis of the permitted nature-based outdoor activities is attached in Appendix B.

Property Management: The property will be enrolled into the County Forest Program and managed consistently with s. 28.11 Wis. Stats., which ensures that the land will be managed for forest products production, recreational opportunities, wildlife, and watershed protection. Management will occur according to the *Iron County Forest Comprehensive Land Use Plan*, as approved by the Department.

PROJECT FINANCES:

A. Appraisals: as required by s.23.0917(7)(e)1., Wis. Stats., land value was determined by a DNR-reviewed and accepted appraisal valuing the subject property at \$103,000.




