Pursuant to s. 23.0917(6m)(a) and (dr), Wis. Stats., the Department is notifying you as co-chairs of the Committee on Joint Finance of a proposed grant of \$495,000.00 from the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program to Ducks Unlimited for land acquisition.

The property is in the Town of Brighton in Kenosha County. The proposed grant funds will secure land contiguous to the Bong State Recreational Area. This 132-acre acquisition will conserve wetlands and open space for wildlife habitat and wildlife based recreational activities. The grantee will not prohibit nature-based outdoor activities as defined in s. 23.0916(1)(b), Wis. Stats.

SUBJECT: Request for approval – Knowles-Nelson Stewardship grant for land acquisition exceeding \$250,000.

Pursuant to s. 23.0917(6m)(a) and (c), Wis. Stats., the Department of Natural Resources is notifying you of a proposed Knowles-Nelson Stewardship grant of \$495,000.00 to Ducks Unlimited for acquisition of 132 acres. The Knowles-Nelson Stewardship program is funded under s. 20.866(2)(ta), Wis. Stats.

#### I. PROJECT DETAILS:

Project Sponsor: Ducks Unlimited

Location: The subject property is in the Town of Brighton, Kenosha County. Project maps are attached

as Appendix A.

**Project Description:** The subject property is 132 acres adjacent to Bong State Recreational Area. The larger Bong Recreational Area encompasses over 4,500 acres managed by DNR as a multi-use outdoor recreation property. One of the most heavily visited DNR properties, Bong Recreation area hosts 217 campsites, a nature center, a lookout tower, birding, hunting, canoeing, fishing, hiking, and 6.5 miles of looped ATV/Dirt Bike trails. The subject parcel is contiguous to the DNR land, this purchase will expand public recreation access at this popular site.

The property is being sold by Kenosha Unified School District, which has not used the property for District programming and resolved to divest. This acquisition represents a partnership between the Bong Naturalist Association, an all-volunteer friends group supporting management of the Recreation Area, and Ducks Unlimited.

**Habitat benefits** – This acquisition will secure habitat beneficial to grassland birds and waterfowl. The parcel has been identified by the Mukwonago Fox Phase III NAWCA Initiative, which identified wetland conservation priorities in southeastern Wisconsin. The parcel offers the ideal mix of wetland and adjacent uplands to support waterfowl breeding area conservation objectives.

Recreational benefits – Acquisition of this property supports the Bong Recreational Master Plan goals to expand trail-based and waterfowl hunting recreation opportunities. Bong Recreational Area is one of the only state properties on which DNR must permit hunting to manage high demand: these DU-purchased acres will add significant waterfowl and other game species habitat to this recreational complex.

**Consistency with conservation planning:** This acquisition meets or supports goals in the following plans:

- The Bong Recreation Area Master Plan by preserving open space and by adding outdoor recreation opportunities.
- The Kenosha County Comprehensive Plan goal to preserve and enhance Kenosha County's natural resources and park and open space sites by preserving and enhancing the existing natural features and open space of the parcel.
- US Fish & Wildlife Service Joint Venture Program which has identified this habitat in this location as a high priority area for waterfowl habitat conservation.



- Wisconsin Waterfowl Habitat Conservation Strategy by restoring and protecting grasslands that within 500 yards of existing wetland habitat in priority watersheds.
- Wisconsin Land Legacy Report which identifies the Bong grasslands as a Legacy place of significance.

**Matching funds and partners**: Bong Naturalist Association and Ducks Unlimited are seeking Stewardship grant funds to leverage significant fundraising success for this purchase.

- Bong Naturalist Association has committed to raising \$100,000 and has secured additional financial support from several partners.
- WE Energies Foundation, Pheasants Forever and the LUMW Foundation have pledged over \$330,000.
- Ducks Unlimited will contribute \$28,000 and has applied for funds from the North American Wetlands Conservation program.
- The seller, Kenosha Unified School District, has committed to a below market value "bargain sale" in order to keep this property a public asset.

**Public Uses:** The property has not been open to hunting or trapping under School District ownership. If the Stewardship grant is awarded, the property will be open to the public for nature based outdoor activities including hunting, trapping, hiking, cross-country skiing and wildlife viewing. The proposed grant will also secure the location of a snowmobile trail. DNR's analysis of public uses is attached as Appendix B.

#### II. PROJECT FINANCES

#### A. Appraisals

Pursuant to S. 23.0917(7)(e)1, Stats., DNR used reviewed two third party appraisals to determine fair market value. Two appraisals valued the property at \$1,060,000 and \$1,330,000 respectively. The Department's recommended grant award is based on the lower of those two. Ducks Unlimited's requested award amounts to less than 50% of project costs.




