SUBJECT: Request for approval of stewardship development grant exceeding \$250,000

Pursuant to s. 23.0917(6m)(a) and (c), Wis. Stats., the Department of Natural Resources is notifying you of a proposed Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program grant in the amount of \$418,420 to the City of Ripon for the Selfridge Park Improvements development project. The Knowles-Nelson Stewardship program is funded under s. 20.866(2)(ta), Wis. Stats.

I. PROJECT DETAILS:

Project Sponsor: City of Ripon

Grant Subprograms: Stewardship Local Assistance; Acquisition and Development of Local Parks and

Urban Rivers

Location: Selfridge Park is located in the City of Ripon, Fond du Lac County.

Project Description: The proposed project will redevelop the existing gravel parking lot into an asphalt parking area, develop a 10' wide park perimeter multi-use path to include the Gothic Millpond overlook, and install a kayak launch and fishing pier. Selfridge Park currently has limited shoreline development on the millpond, which is the only public water access site in the City of Ripon. The development of these new amenities will enhance the overall park user experience. A location map and conceptual site plan for this project can be found in Appendix A.

Public Benefit: The perimeter trail, overlook area, kayak launch, and fishing pier will be fully accessible to all abilities to enjoy the shoreline and provides greater water access that is currently lacking in the park. This project will help the city achieve improved public access to the only waterbody within the municipality in a safe and inclusive manner.

Coordination with recreational planning: This project will advance the purposes of the Stewardship Local Assistance, Acquisition and Development of Local Parks (ADLP) and Urban Rivers (UR) grant programs and objectives of local and regional recreation planning efforts. Specifically, the project is supported in the City of Ripon Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan (2023-28). Per the purposes of the Stewardship ADLP and UR grant programs, the park improvements will provide new public nature-based outdoor recreation facilities, enhance public water access, and implement recommendations from the City of Ripon Parks Master Plan, Year 2030 Regional Comprehensive Plan, Ripon Main Street Analysis and the City of Ripon 5-Year Capital Improvement Plan

Public Access: Selfridge Park will be available to the public from 8:00 am to 10:00 pm, 7 days per week, and 365 days per year. Users will be able to walk, jog, run, bike, inline skate, and snowshoe on the perimeter trail, launch canoes and kayaks onto the Gothic Millpond, and participate in wildlife viewing and fishing once the project is completed. These activities will enhance the existing park facilities that include restrooms with a small shelter area, playground, and small skate park area.



Property Management: Selfridge Park will be operated and maintained by the City of Ripon. The project will be designed and constructed to reduce future maintenance costs and the City plans to utilize their park fund to perform long-term maintenance.

Timetable: Construction is scheduled to begin spring of 2024 and is estimated to be completed and fully open to the public by fall 2024.




