SUBJECT: Request for approval of stewardship development grant exceeding \$250,000

Pursuant to s. 23.0917(6m)(a) and (c), Wis. Stats., the Department of Natural Resources is notifying you of a proposed Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program grant in the amount of \$318,750.00 to City of Wauwatosa for the 116th Street Park development project. The Knowles-Nelson Stewardship program is funded under s. 20.866(2)(ta), Wis. Stats.

I. PROJECT DETAILS:

Project Sponsor: City of Wauwatosa

Grant Subprogram: Acquisition and Development of Local Parks (ADLP)

Location: 116th Street Park is located in the City of Wauwatosa, Milwaukee County.

Project Description: The proposed project will construct a public restroom and associated utilities, path lighting and site furnishings, wayfinding signage and a drinking fountain at the newly developed 116th Street Park. The restroom will be a prefabricated structure with high quality, low maintenance finishes. The restroom will be fully accessible and include an adult changing station. A map and conceptual site plan for this project are attached.

Public Benefit: As a city park, the public will have access to the site 365 days per year during park operating hours will be 7:00 am to 10:00 pm. There will be dedicated street parking along 116th Street and Gilbert Ave. and will include handicapped parking stalls. New sidewalks will be installed to aid in pedestrian access from the surrounding neighborhoods. The city is focused on providing uses that fill gaps in their current recreational offerings. The park design emphasizes a community hub comprised of accessible and multi-generational play, picnic pavilion, restroom, nature-based play, and storm water management educational programming. From the community hub trails and walkways will allow park visitors to explore passive elements such as woodlands, wetlands, and a great lawn. The design also includes a sledding hill for residents to use during the winter months.

Coordination with recreational planning: This project will advance the purposes of the Acquisition and Development of Local Parks grant program and objectives of local and regional recreation planning efforts by:

- providing new public nature-based outdoor recreation facilities.
- Implementing recommendations from the City of Wauwatosa Active Tosa Plan:
 - Goal 1 Boost Participation By developing a new park, the City is expanding recreation facilities to meet the demand of a growing population and emphasizing multigenerational opportunities to encourage more residents to participate in outdoor recreation, particularly as they age.
 - o Goal 2 Grow Partnerships By partnering with the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) and the City of Wauwatosa Tourism Commission the project is



cultivating collaboration between outdoor recreation groups and non-traditional partners.

Public Access: The 116th Street Park will be available to the public from 7:00 am to 10:00 pm, 7 days per week, and 365 days per year. Users will be able to enjoy outdoor recreational opportunities where there currently isn't a local park.

Property Management: 116th Street Park will be operated and maintained by the City of Wauwatosa.

Timetable: Construction will begin March 2024. The project will be completed and fully open to the public by May 2025.

Partnerships: The Department of Natural Resources is a partner on this element of the park development project. The larger overall park development project includes partnerships with the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewage District – Fresh Coast Green and the Milwaukee Metropolitan Sewage District – Green Solutions Program.


