SUBJECT: Request for approval of stewardship development grant exceeding \$250,000

Pursuant to s. 23.0917(6m)(a) and (c), Wis. Stats., the Department of Natural Resources is notifying you of a proposed Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program grant in the amount of \$335,000 to City of Oconomowoc for the John and Lavinia Rockwell Park Restrooms and Pavilion development project. The Knowles-Nelson Stewardship program is funded under s. 20.866(2)(ta), Wis. Stats.

I. PROJECT DETAILS:

Project Sponsor: City of Oconomowoc

Grant Subprogram: Acquisition and Development of Local Parks

Location: John and Lavinia Rockwell Park is located in the City of Oconomowoc, Waukesha County.

Project Description: This project will construct ADA accessible restrooms, pavilion, utility work, pathway, stairwell, lighting, and site furnishings at Rockwell Park. The park is located on a unique parcel that sits between Lac La Belle and Fowler Lake, providing canoe/kayak access to both lakes and portage around the dam located between them. The proposed restrooms will be built into a hill, which will lower the demands for heating/cooling. Most of the remaining park will remain green space to reduce the heat island effect. The public fundraised the \$2 million to purchase the property and keep it green space, and additionally raised over \$600,000 to do the initial development of the park. A map and conceptual site plan for this project are attached.

Public Benefit: Providing support facilities such as a restroom and pavilion to a developed park allows users to stay and recreate longer. It will give the public a reason to stop while they are kayaking or canoeing on Lac La Belle or Fowler Lake and enjoy the park amenities. These facilities will allow the city to utilize this park for more activities, special events, fundraisers, etc.

Coordination with recreational planning: This project will advance the purposes of the Acquisition and Development of Local Parks grant program and objectives of local and regional recreation planning efforts by:

- providing new public nature-based outdoor recreation facilities.
- enhancing public access to the park.
- implementing recommendations from the City of Oconomowoc 2030 Park and Open Space Plan and the Statewide Comprehensive Outdoor Recreation Plan.

Public Access: The John and Lavinia Rockwell Park will be available to the public from 7:00 am-10:00 pm, 7 days per week, and 365 days per year. Users will be able to enjoy the open green space, the canoe/kayak launches on Lac La Belle and Fowler Lake, walk and bike on the pathways, sit on one of the new benches and enjoy the view of both lakes, use the pavilion for shade, a picnic on a nice day, or plan a special event.



Property Management: John and Lavinia Rockwell Park will be operated and maintained by the City of Oconomowoc.

Timetable: Construction will begin April 2024. It will be completed and fully open to the public by December 2024.

Partnerships: The Build Rockwell Team is fundraising the entire match for this project, \$335,000.
