



On behalf of the Division of Care and Treatment Services, which operates the three state Intellectual and Developmental Disability (IDD) Centers—Central Wisconsin Center, Northern Wisconsin Center, and Southern Wisconsin Center—the Department of Health Services is submitting its response to Wis.
