Dear Senator Darling and Representative Nygren:

This letter serves as a report to the Joint Committee on Finance on the Service Award Program administered by the Department of Administration, as required by s. 16.25(6).

The State of Wisconsin created the Service Award Program, formerly called the Length of Service Award Program, under 1999 Wisconsin Act 105. The Program establishes by rule a tax-deferred benefit program for volunteer fire fighters, emergency medical technicians, and first responders. The intent of the Program is to assist municipalities in training and retaining volunteers.

For service year 2016, the Service Award Program matched \$2,264,359.05 in municipal contributions with \$1,963,238.73 from state funds. This number is made up of awards to 6,280 individual volunteer firefighters and emergency medical service personnel from 238 participating departments.

The state match for the 2016 service year was \$344.11, up from \$343.77 for the 2015 service year. The state match for the 2017 service year will be \$390 but at a \$2 state match for every \$1 municipal dollar contributed up to a maximum state contribution of \$390.

There are currently four vendors providing administrative services and investment plans to the Program. All four vendors were chosen utilizing the criteria of the State Procurement Manual.
