Section 36.45(4) of the Wisconsin Statutes requires the University of Wisconsin System to report annually to the Joint Committee on Finance the number of research contracts considered under the process established in s. 36.11(55m)(e), Wis. Stats., and the outcome of those contracts.

2013 Wisconsin Act 289, which created the process for considering research contracts involving government security classifications or similar restrictions, was enacted on April 17, 2014. For the period ending June 30, 2019, seven research contracts were reviewed using the criteria established in s. 36.11(55m), Wis. Stats:

- **UW-Madison:** Six contracts were considered. All six contracts satisfied the relevant statutory requirements and were approved.
- **UW-Milwaukee:** One contract was considered. The contract satisfied the relevant statutory requirements and was approved.

Additionally, while not a contract that falls under s. 36.45(4), Wis. Stats., UW-Stout has a federal grant that funds student tuition in cybersecurity after which the student works for a defense/security agency. The contract is not a research contract involving government security classifications.
