SUBJECT: 2019-20 General School Aids Amounts for All School Districts

This memorandum provides information on the calculation of general school aids and the aid payments to be received by each school district in 2019-20.

General School Aids

The general school aids appropriation funds equalization, integration (Chapter 220), and special adjustment aids. In 2019-20, \$4,740.0 million from the general fund is provided in the general school aids appropriation. Of the total amount of funding provided, 399 of the state's 421 school districts are eligible for \$4,687.7 million in equalization aid, 25 districts are eligible for \$46.7 million in integration aid, and 61 districts are eligible for \$5.7 million in special adjustment aid.

Equalization Aid. A major objective of the equalization aid formula is tax base equalization. The formula operates under the principle of equal tax rate for equal per pupil expenditures. In pure form, this means that a school district's property tax rate does not depend on the property tax base of the district, but rather on the level of expenditures. The provision of state aid through the formula allows a district to support a given level of per pupil expenditures with a similar local property tax rate as other districts with the same level of per pupil expenditures, regardless of property tax wealth. There is an inverse relationship between equalization aid and property valuations. Districts with low per pupil property valuations receive a larger share of their costs through the formula than districts with high per pupil property valuations.

The equalization aid formula is calculated using school district data (pupil membership, shared costs, and equalized valuations) from the prior school year. There are three guaranteed valuations used in the equalization formula that are applied to three different expenditure levels. The rate at which shared costs are aided through the formula is determined by comparing a district's per pupil property value to the three guaranteed valuations. Equalization aid is provided to make up the difference between the district's actual tax base and the state's guaranteed tax base.

Primary Tier. The first tier is for shared costs up to the primary cost ceiling of \$1,000 per member. State aid on these primary shared costs is calculated using the primary guaranteed valuation of \$1,930,000 per member. Both the primary cost ceiling and the primary guarantee are set in statute. Primary aid is based on a comparison of the school district's equalized valuation per member to the \$1,930,000. Primary aid equals the amount of costs that would be funded by the missing portion of the guaranteed tax base. Every district whose equalized valuation per member is below \$1,930,000 receives at least the primary aid amount. Primary aid cannot be reduced by negative aid generated at the secondary or tertiary aid levels. This feature of the formula is referred to as the primary aid hold harmless.

Secondary Tier. The second tier is for shared costs that exceed \$1,000 per member but are less than the secondary cost ceiling, which is equal to \$9,782 per member in 2019-20. By law, the secondary cost ceiling is set equal to 90% of the prior year statewide shared cost per member. The state's sharing of secondary costs is calculated using the secondary guaranteed valuation. By law, the secondary guarantee is set at the amount that generates equalization aid entitlements that are equal to the total amount of funding available for distribution. In 2019-20, the secondary guaranteed valuation is \$1,329,139.

Tertiary Tier. The third tier is for shared costs that exceed the secondary cost ceiling of \$9,782 per member in 2019-20. State aid on tertiary shared costs is calculated using the tertiary guarantee, which, by law, is set at the statewide average equalized valuation per member. The tertiary guarantee is \$621,416 in aid year 2019-20. If a school district's tertiary aid is a negative number, this amount is deducted from its secondary aid. As noted above, if the sum of a district's secondary and tertiary aid is a negative number, this amount is not deducted from its primary aid amount.

For most school districts, equalization aid is the only type of general school aid received. In 2019-20, however, 22 districts had a per pupil equalized value above the primary guaranteed valuation and are not eligible to receive equalization aid.

For school district consolidations that took effect before July 1, 2019, the cost ceilings and guaranteed valuations in the equalization formula are increased by 15% in each of the first five years after the consolidation for the districts involved. This provision is intended to provide additional aid to consolidated districts. Two consolidated districts have their equalization aid calculated under these provisions. The Herman, Neosho, and Rubicon School Districts consolidated beginning in the 2016-17 school year. The Friess Lake and Richfield J1 School Districts consolidated to form the Holy Hill Area School District beginning in the 2018-19 school year.

Integration Aid. Under the integration aid program (commonly called Chapter 220 after the 1975 session law), the state provides funds as an incentive for districts to voluntarily improve racial balance within and between school districts. To be eligible, a school district must transfer pupils between attendance areas or districts with certain concentrations of minority or nonminority pupil populations. Integration aid is fully funded as a first draw from the general school aids appropriation.

Integration aid is calculated through two different formulas depending upon whether a pupil is transferred within a school district (**intradistrict**) or from one school district to another

(**inter**district). Under both formulas, school districts receive state aid based on the number of pupils transferred in the prior school year.

Intradistrict Transfer Aid. State aid is based on the school district's equalization aid per pupil multiplied by 25% of the number of eligible transfer pupils. As part of the neighborhood schools initiative in 1999 Act 9, a hold harmless was established on the intradistrict aid entitlement for Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS), which is generally equal to the greater of: (a) the 1998-99 aid amount (\$32.9 million); or (b) the actual aid entitlement generated under the formula.

Interdistrict Transfer Aid. The state provides financial support to both the district which accepts the transfers (the receiving district) and the district from which the transfers came (the sending district).

The receiving district is paid an amount equal to its average net cost per pupil for each transfer accepted. Net cost per pupil is calculated by dividing the sum of the district's shared costs and interdistrict aid received in the prior year by the sum of the district's aid membership and the number of transfer pupils in the prior year.

The sending district can count each pupil transferred to another district as 0.75 member for general school aid purposes, which is commonly referred to as "sender aid." However, a separate integration aid payment is not calculated for sending districts. Instead, the district receives these funds as part of its equalization aid payment.

Under 2015 Act 55, the Chapter 220 program started to be phased out beginning in the 2016-17 school year. Under Act 55, pupils may not attend a school under the program unless they were participating in the program in the 2015-16 school year, and a district can only receive integration aid for pupils who attended a school in the district under the program in the 2015-16 school year.

Act 55 also created a seven-year hold harmless provision under which a district's integration aid entitlement in a given year during that period cannot be less than an amount equal to its 2014-15 aid entitlement multiplied by a specified percentage. Under this provision, in the 2019-20 aid year, a district's integration aid entitlement cannot be less than 37.5% of its 2014-15 entitlement. In 2019-20, all four of the districts receiving intradistrict aid were subject to a hold harmless provision, while 12 of the 22 districts receiving interdistrict aid received additional aid under the hold harmless provision.

Special Adjustment Aid. Special adjustment aid is also fully funded as a first draw from the general school aids appropriation. Under the main type of special adjustment aid, the state provides additional general aid to districts as a hold harmless to limit any year-to-year decline in a district's general aid payment. An eligible district receives a payment equal to the amount needed to make the district's total general aid eligibility equal to 85% of its prior year's general aid payment.

Consolidated districts are eligible for a second type of special adjustment aid. In each of the first five years after consolidation, the new district is guaranteed to receive at least as much general aid as the separate districts received in the year prior to consolidation. If the consolidated district's general aid eligibility in any of those years is less than that amount, special adjustment aid will be paid in the amount needed to make up the difference. The Holy Hill Area School District received

aid under this provision.

Prior Year Adjustments. In calculating general school aids each year in October, the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) makes adjustments that are necessary based on the prior year's final general aid eligibility, which is calculated annually in June. The June eligibility amount may differ from the prior October's eligibility amount because of modifications in school district aid factors due to further data collection or auditing. In 2019-20, 345 districts will receive positive prior year aid adjustments totaling \$193,000, 20 districts will receive negative prior year aid adjustments totaling \$223,000, and 55 districts will receive no prior year aid adjustment.

Other K-12 Education Programs. General aid payments to school districts are also affected by the statutory funding provisions for other K-12 programs, such as the open enrollment program, private school choice programs, and the independent charter school program. While the specific details of the funding for these programs differ to some degree, there are two general methods by which they are funded.

The first method is used to fund the open enrollment program, incoming pupils in the Racine and statewide private school choice programs, the special needs scholarship program, and the independent charter school program as it relates to entities that were allowed to authorize schools under 2015 Act 55 or after. Under this method, the district of residence for pupils participating in the program is able to count those pupils for revenue limit purposes (open enrollment, post-Act 55 independent charters) or receive a nonrecurring revenue limit adjustment for those pupils (special needs scholarship and Racine and statewide choice programs). The district of residence counts all of these pupils for general aid purposes. The general aid payment for the district is reduced by a specified amount related to the payments to the district or school of attendance for those pupils. Statutes specify that these aid reductions do not affect the amount determined to be received by the district as general aid for any other purpose, so these aid reductions are not shown in DPI's October 15 aid calculation. As a result, the district is not able to levy property taxes to make up for, or backfill, that aid reduction under revenue limits. In 2018-19, aid transfers between school districts under the public school open enrollment program totaled approximately \$452.7 million. The 2019-20 aid reductions associated with the other programs are: (a) Racine and statewide private school choice programs--\$95.6 million; (b) special needs scholarship program--\$13.0 million; and (c) post Act 55 independent charter school program--\$2.7 million.

The second method is used to fund the Milwaukee private school choice program and the independent charter school program as it relates to entities that were allowed to authorize charter schools prior to 2015 Act 55. Under this method, the district of residence is not able to count pupils participating in the program for revenue limit and general aid purposes. The general aid payment for either the district of residence (Milwaukee choice program) or for all districts statewide (pre-Act 55 independent charters) is reduced by a specified amount related to the cost of payments under the program. Statutes do not specify any unique treatment of these aid reductions for other purposes, and these aid reductions are shown in DPI's October 15 aid calculation. As a result, districts are able to levy to backfill these aid reductions under revenue limits.

For the purposes of this memorandum, the key difference between the two methods is the statutory treatment of the aid reduction and whether a district is able to levy to backfill the reduction. Consistent with DPI's October 15 aid calculation, the aid reductions made under the

first method described above are not shown in Attachment 1, while the aid reductions made under the second method are shown in Attachment 1 and are further described below.

Under the independent charter school program, the City of Milwaukee, UW-Milwaukee, and UW-Parkside were able to contract to operate charter schools prior to 2015 Act 55. DPI pays the operators of these charter schools a statutorily-determined per pupil amount each year (\$8,911 in 2019-20). By law, DPI is required to proportionally reduce the general aid for which each school district is eligible by an amount totaling the estimated payments under the program. Based on the October 15, 2019, general school aids estimate, in 2019-20, general aid statewide will be reduced by a total of \$75.4 million for these independent charter schools. Each district's general aid will be reduced proportionately by 1.6% to generate the total statewide amount of \$75.4 million. The Department calculates this reduction individually for each type of general school aid. Under revenue limits, school districts may levy property taxes to make up for the amount of revenue lost due to these aid reductions.

Under the Milwaukee private school choice program, the state pays a statutorily-determined per pupil amount for children from eligible families to attend participating private schools. The payment for 2019-20 is \$8,046 for a pupil in grades K-8 and \$8,692 for a pupil in grades 9-12. For the Milwaukee program, DPI is required by law to reduce the general aid for which MPS is eligible in 2019-20 by a net amount of 16.0% of the estimated total cost of the Milwaukee program, after consideration of aid that is paid to the City of Milwaukee to reduce the levy it raises on behalf of MPS. (Under the provisions of 2013 Act 20, this percentage will be reduced by 3.2 percentage points each year, until no aid reduction is made after 2024-25.) The October 15, 2019, general aid calculation uses an estimate of \$230.1 million for the total cost of the Milwaukee program in 2019-20. Thus, MPS's general aid will be reduced by a total of \$36.8 million.

Under revenue limits, MPS can levy to make up for the aid reduction. Under 2007 Act 20, a separate aid program was created to provide aid to districts with high poverty. By law, any high poverty aid MPS receives must be used to offset the choice levy attributable to the general aid reduction. In 2019-20, MPS will receive \$5.0 million in high poverty aid. After consideration of high poverty aid, the effective aid reduction for MPS related to the choice program is \$31.8 million, which is 13.8% of the estimated cost of the program in 2019-20.

After the aid reductions for the pre-Act 55 independent charter and Milwaukee choice programs, the net amount of general aid funding paid to school districts is \$4,627.8 million, which provides \$4,579.2 million for equalization aid, \$43.0 million for integration aid and \$5.6 million for special adjustment aid.

Description of Attachment 1. Attachment 1 provides general school aids information for each school district for 2019-20, based on the October 15, 2019, aid calculation completed by DPI. (The amounts shown in the attachment may differ slightly from the official aid calculation prepared by DPI due to different rounding conventions.) Aid for 2019-20 is calculated using 2018-19 pupil memberships, equalized values, and shared costs. Specifically, the attachment provides the following information:

Column 1: School district name, listed alphabetically;

- Column 2: 2018-19 pupil membership;
- Column 3: 2018-19 equalized value per member, adjusted for union high school and K-8 districts;
- Column 4: 2018-19 shared cost per member;
- Column 5: 2019-20 equalization aid eligibility, including prior year adjustments;
- Column 6: 2019-20 integration aid eligibility, including prior year adjustments;
- Column 7: 2019-20 special adjustment aid eligibility, including prior year adjustments (a negative number represents a prior year aid adjustment for a district that was eligible for special adjustment aid in 2018-19 but not in 2019-20);
- Column 8: Total net MPS general school aids reduction for the Milwaukee private school choice program in 2019-20;
- Column 9: Total general school aids reduction for pre-Act 55 independent charter schools in 2019-20; and
- Column 10: Total net 2019-20 general school aids payment, including equalization, integration, and special adjustment aids, prior year adjustments, and choice and charter reductions.

High Poverty Aid

Under the 2007-09 biennial budget act, an appropriation was created to provide additional unrestricted aid to school districts with high poverty. In 2019-20, over \$16.8 million from the general fund is appropriated for high poverty aid.

In 2019-20, a school district is eligible for aid if at least 50% of the district's enrollment on the third Friday of September in the immediately preceding even-numbered year, rounded to the nearest whole percentage point, satisfied the income eligibility criteria for a free or reduced-price lunch in the national school lunch program. Aid per pupil is calculated by dividing the appropriated amount by the total pupil membership of all eligible districts. A district's total payment is determined by multiplying that amount by each district's number of pupils enrolled. A total of 102 districts are eligible for aid in 2019-20. Attachment 2 shows the amount of high poverty aid received in 2019-20 by each of the eligible districts.

For all school districts except MPS, this aid is subject to revenue limits. For MPS, the property tax levied to offset the aid reduction attributable to the Milwaukee private school choice program is, by law, reduced by the amount of high poverty aid received by MPS. In either case, the effect of this aid reduces the property tax levy of the eligible school district. Because high poverty aid has the effect of reducing the amount of property taxes levied by the school districts that receive this aid, it is considered a form of general school aids.
