## Preface

### To the Third Edition

This is the third edition of the Legislative District Almanac published by the Legislative Reference Bureau. It is designed to provide legislators, other policy makers, and citizens with demographic data on Wisconsin's 33 state senate districts and 99 assembly districts. To make the information easier to use, we have added many new charts and graphs not found in previous editions.

The legislative districts used are those created by 2011 Wisconsin Act 43, with the exception of Assembly Districts 8 and 9 which were altered by an order of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin on April 11, 2011.

The almanac is divided into 33 chapters, one for each state senate district and the three assembly districts which comprise it. Each chapter begins with a district map showing the counties and municipalities in the district. The map is followed by various tables, graphs, and charts. Tables provide information on sex, veteran status, and population living in group quarters. The charts and graphs depict race and ethnicity, age, educational attainment, employment status, benefits, occupation, industry, income, gross rent, housing occupancy, and the value of owner occupied housing. Maps, tables, charts, and graphs are presented in the same order for each district.




Dana Wolff of the Legislative Technology Services Bureau produced the 33 senate district maps preceding each chapter. This publication could not have been compiled without her contribution.







**Detail Map: Madison Area**




**Detail Map: Milwaukee Area**

## Appendices

### APPENDIX A: Methodology

The districts analyzed in this almanac are those created by 2011 Wisconsin Act 43, with one exception: an order of the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Wisconsin on April 11, 2011 altered the boundary between Assembly Districts 8 and 9.

Basic data on population and race is taken from the block level Census data distributed to states pursuant to PL 94-171 on March 10, 2011. This data was used to assist the legislature in enacting the 2011 redistricting legislation.

Data on age and sex is derived from the U.S. Census Bureau Summary File (SF) 1 dataset. Data from SF 1 is gathered from all inhabitants at the block level, the lowest level at which the Census Bureau collects data and therefore matches legislative districts most closely. The block level data was then aggregated into Assembly Districts and Senate Districts created by 2011 Wisconsin Act 43.

Data on housing characteristics, economic characteristics, and social characteristics (excluding age and race) is derived from the American Community Survey (ACS). The ACS provides data down to the census tract level, but these are estimates, not exact enumerations. Because of this the population figures may not precisely match population figures from other sources. Data was aggregated by census tracts, towns, villages, cities, and counties to match the districts created by 2011 Wisconsin Act 43. Where census tracts were divided between districts, the ACS estimates are divided by the same ratio as the tract's Census 2010 population within each district. For example, if a census tract was divided between two assembly districts, it was divided according to the percentage population within each district based on the block level population figures in the Census Bureau's PL 94-171 data. Estimates of three adjoining assembly districts may not add to the total of the senate district they comprise because of rounding.

**APPENDIX B: Table Notes**

1. **Race and Ethnicity:** Racial categories are based on the U.S. Department of Justice guidelines published in the Federal Register of January 18, 2001. In the 2000 census and 2010 census, respondents could choose more than one race. Those that chose “white” and then another race were put into the category of the other race, thus each racial category (other than “white”) includes all those who responded with that race plus “white.” Hispanic is an ethnic classification rather than a racial classification under the guidelines of the Census Bureau and is therefore a separate category from race. Although all those identifying themselves as Hispanic also listed themselves as some race or races, they are considered Hispanic in the charts of Race and Ethnicity.
2. **Population in Group Quarters:** This table does not present an exhaustive list of group living situations. Rather it presents the most common group quarters categories for which the American Community Survey gathers statistics and lists the rest as “other.”
3. **Educational Attainment:** These figures come from an analysis of total population 25 years of age and older.
4. **Industry:** These figures come from an analysis of civilian employed population 16 years and over.

## APPENDIX C: Glossary

The following definitions are those used by the U.S. Census Bureau in the 2010 Census of the United States.

*Block:* A subdivision of a census tract (or, prior to 2000, a block numbering area), a block is the smallest geographic unit for which the Census Bureau tabulates 100-percent data. Many blocks correspond to individual city blocks bounded by streets, but blocks – especially in rural areas – may include many square miles and may have some boundaries that are not streets.

*Block Group:* A subdivision of a census tract (or, prior to 2000, a block numbering area), a block group is the smallest geographic unit for which the Census Bureau tabulates sample data. A block group consists of all the blocks within a census tract with the same beginning number.

*Educational Attainment:* Refers to the highest level of education completed in terms of the highest degree or the highest level of schooling completed.

*Employed:* Employed includes all civilians 16 years old and over who were either (1) “at work” – those who did any work at all during the reference week as paid employees, worked in their own business or profession, worked on their own farm, or worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers on a family farm or in a family business; or (2) were “with a job but not at work” – those who did not work during the reference week but had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent due to illness, bad weather, industrial dispute, vacation, or other personal reasons. Excluded from the employed are people whose only activity consisted of work around the house or unpaid volunteer work for religious, charitable, and similar organizations; also excluded are people on active duty in the United States Armed Forces. The reference week is the calendar week preceding the date on which the respondents completed their questionnaires or were interviewed. This week may not be the same for all respondents.

*Ethnicity:* There are two minimum categories for ethnicity: *Hispanic or Latino* and *Not Hispanic or Latino*. The federal government considers race and Hispanic origin to be two separate and distinct concepts. Hispanics and Latinos may be of any race.

*Hispanic or Latino:* For Census 2000, American Community Survey: People who identify with the terms “Hispanic” or “Latino” are those who classify themselves in one of the specific Hispanic or Latino categories listed on the Census 2000 or ACS questionnaire – “Mexican,” “Puerto Rican,” or “Cuban” – as well as those who indicate that they are “other Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino.” Origin can be viewed as the heritage, nationality group, lineage, or country of birth of the person or the person’s parents or ancestors before their arrival in the United States. People who identify their origin as Spanish, Hispanic, or Latino may be of any race.

*Gross Rent:* The amount of the contract rent plus the estimated average monthly cost of utilities (electricity, gas, and water and sewer) and fuels (oil, coal, kerosene, wood, etc.) if these are paid for by the renter (or paid for the renter by someone else). Gross rent is intended to eliminate differentials which result from varying practices with respect to the inclusion of utilities and fuels as part of the rental payment.

*Group Quarters:* The Census Bureau classifies all people not living in households as living in group

quarters. There are two types of group quarters: institutional (for example, correctional facilities, nursing homes, and mental hospitals) and noninstitutional (for example, college dormitories, military barracks, group homes, missions, and shelters).

*Group Quarters Population:* Includes all people not living in households. This term includes those people residing in group quarters as of the date on which a particular survey was conducted. Two general categories of people in group quarters are recognized: 1) the institutionalized population which includes people under formally authorized supervised care or custody in institutions at the time of enumeration (such as correctional institutions, nursing homes, and juvenile institutions) and 2) the noninstitutionalized population which includes all people who live in group quarters other than institutions (such as college dormitories, military quarters, and group homes). The noninstitutionalized population includes all people who live in group quarters other than institutions.

*Household:* A household includes all the people who occupy a housing unit as their usual place of residence.

*Income:* “Total income” is the sum of the amounts reported separately for wages, salary, commissions, bonuses, or tips; self-employment income from own nonfarm or farm businesses, including proprietorships and partnerships; interest, dividends, net rental income, royalty income, or income from estates and trusts; Social Security or Railroad Retirement income; Supplemental Security Income (SSI); any public assistance or welfare payments from the state or local welfare office; retirement, survivor, or disability pensions; and any other sources of income received regularly such as Veterans’ (VA) payments, unemployment compensation, child support, or alimony.

*Industry:* Information on industry relates to the kind of business conducted by a person’s employing organization. For employed people the data refer to the person’s job during the reference week. For those who worked at two or more jobs, the data refer to the job at which the person worked the greatest number of hours. Some examples of industrial groups shown in products include agriculture, forestry, and fisheries; construction; manufacturing; wholesale or retail trade; transportation and communication; personal, professional and entertainment services; and public administration.

*Institutionalized Group Quarters Population:* People under formally authorized, supervised care or custody in institutions at the time of enumeration. Generally, restricted to the institution, under the care or supervision of trained staff, and classified as “patients” or “inmates.”

*Labor Force:* The labor force includes all people classified in the civilian labor force, plus members of the U.S. Armed Forces (people on active duty with the United States Army, Air Force, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard). The Civilian Labor Force consists of people classified as employed or unemployed. The figures are calculated for population 16 years of age and older.

*Noninstitutionalized Group Quarters Population:* Includes all people who live in group quarters other than institutions.

*Occupation:* Occupation describes the kind of work the person does on the job. For employed people, the data refer to the person’s job during the reference week. For those who worked at two or more jobs, the data refer to the job at which the person worked the greatest number of hours. Some examples of occupational groups shown in this product include managerial occupations; business and financial specialists;

scientists and technicians; entertainment; healthcare; food service; personal services; sales; office and administrative support; farming; maintenance and repair; and production workers.

*Race:* Race is a self-identification data item in which respondents choose the race or races with which they most closely identify.

*Unemployed:* All civilians 16 years old and over are classified as unemployed if they (1) were neither “at work” nor “with a job but not at work” during the reference week, and (2) were actively looking for work during the last 4 weeks, and (3) were available to accept a job. Also included as unemployed are civilians who did not work at all during the reference week, were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off, and were available for work except for temporary illness.

*Value of Owner Occupied Housing:* Value is the respondent’s estimate of how much the property (house and lot, mobile home and lot, or condominium unit) would sell for if it were for sale.

*Veteran Status:* A “civilian veteran” is a person 18 years old or over who has served (even for a short time), but is not now serving, on active duty in the U.S. Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, or the Coast Guard, or who served in the U.S. Merchant Marine during World War II. People who served in the National Guard or military Reserves are classified as veterans only if they were ever called or ordered to active duty, not counting the 4-6 months for initial training or yearly summer camps. All other civilians 16 years old and over are classified as nonveterans.
