SECTION III: ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE OF CHARTER SCHOOLS

i4Learning converted Wayne Elementary to an autonomous, instrumentality charter school within the Kewaskum School District in 2015. It serves 4 year-old Kindergarten through 5th grade by incorporating the community's unique resources with the 21st century need for collaboration and innovation. Our focus is to view learning from the lens of a farmer, in order to create the Agricultural model of education that Sir Ken Robinson, in his TED talk video on "Bring on the learning revolution!" aspires us to create. He states, "Human flourishing is not a mechanical process, it is an organic process. You cannot predict the outcome of human development, all you can do - like a farmer - is create the conditions under which they will begin to flourish."

By moving away from the industrialized model (ringing bells, separate subject areas, linear progression---educating by age---, and conformity) and moving toward the agricultural model (organic, innovative, personalized, and utilizing community resources) of education, i4Learning hopes to become a model that our district, state and world will collaborate with and learn from. With the aid of technology, our educational communities can and should become global learning networks.

In order to help organically guide and grow autonomous (life-long) learners, i4Learning is based upon clusters that intertwine. The four "i" clusters that revolve around the "Life-Long Learner" are: Individualized, Intrinsic, Integrated, and Innovative. Individualized focuses on student skill level, learning needs and proficiency based progressions. Intrinsic helps students know themselves as learners by exposing them to the concepts behind the "Growth Mindset" (Dweck, 2007) and "The Talent Code" (Coyle, 2009). As for Integrated, observers see project-based learning opportunities that may incorporate any one of the sixteen Wisconsin Career Clusters. Finally, Innovative allows for asynchronous (any time, any place, any path) learning, as well as exploring how to eliminate traditional grades and move towards a badge system of achievement.

In order to close the achievement gap, we recognize that learning takes place at any time, any place, and along any path. i4Learning strives to create an autonomous learning model that allows for the asynchronous development of students by allowing them to solidify concepts of learning before moving on to the next building block. Thus, our model is multi-aged and progressions happen along a continuum that is proficiency-based. We focus on closing the achievement gaps in socioeconomic status, as well as gaps based on disability status. i4Learning's mission is to ignite a passion for life-long learning through individualization, real-life exploration opportunities and 21st century thinking; thus, it will reflect the methods and values of the farming community in which it was founded.

i4Learning planned to administer the following assessments during the 2019-2020 academic year:

- Fastbridge: i4L used Fastbridge aMath (1-5) and Fastbridge aReading (K-5) as universal screeners for students
- Wisconsin Forward
- Fountas & Pinnell is utilized for individual assessment and a step in the informed decision making process. Due to the closure, the data was not relevant enough to be included in the report this school year.
