July 1 – September 30, 2021

As has been the case, the Governor's Office and the Department of Administration continue to maintain frequent communication with Wisconsin's federal delegation, the White House, and other federal agencies regarding the state and federal government's response to the coronavirus pandemic, ensuring our state's continued economic recovery, as well as other issues affecting our state.

On September 20, 2021, Governor Tony Evers appointed Noah Roberts to serve as Director of the State of Wisconsin Federal-State Relations Office. In addition to standard communication with members of the Wisconsin Congressional Delegation, during the short duration that Noah Roberts has served as Director, the Office has conducted introductory outreach to each member of the Wisconsin Congressional Delegation. Additionally, the State Federal Director has begun outreach efforts to engage the federal administration and agencies, the National Governors Association, and other Wisconsin partners conducting business before the United States government.
