The agency collaborated with law enforcement and medical professionals to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found a preponderance of the evidence to substantiate maltreatment of physical abuse to the infant by the father. Medical professionals determined the injuries were non-accidental in nature. The agency determined the infant and her sibling unsafe and implemented a safety plan with their mother; the infant's father was arrested. The case remained open for in-home case management services

The agency collaborated with law enforcement to complete the assessment. The Initial Assessment completed by the agency found insufficient evidence to substantiate neglect of the infant by the infant's mother. No signs of trauma to the infant were noted; the autopsy report is pending. The agency deemed the infant's 6-year-old half-sibling and 5-year-old sibling safe and they remained with their mother and the infant and 5-year-old's father. The agency referred the family to community services and closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
