Description of the incident, including the suspected cause of death, injury or egregious abuse or neglect: On January 3, 2021, the agency received a CPS Report regarding a 5-month-old infant found unresponsive in her home and late pronounced deceased at the hospital. Law enforcement was contacted and initiated a criminal investigation. No signs of traum were noted; the autopsy report is pending. No criminal charges have been filed in this case, and the investigation remains open
Findings by agency, including maltreatment determination and material circumstances leading to incident: The agency collaborated with law enforcement to complete the assessment. The Alternative Response Initial Assessment completed by the agency determined services were not needed. No signs of trauma were noted; the autopsy report is pending. The agency deemed the infant's 9-year-old and 12-year-old half-siblings unsafe and initiated a Protective Plan. Subsequently the children were determined to be safe and the Protective Plan was terminated. The family was referred to community services, and the agency closed the case upon completion of the Initial Assessment.
