Section III: Academic Performance of Charter Schools Wildlands Charter School Academic Performance Summary 2021-22

Wildlands is a project-based learning school with students from grades 7-12 attending. The enrollment for 2020-21 was 72 students. 23 were in the 7th-8th grade cohort, the 49 in the 9th-12th grade cohort. Wildlands utilizes project-based learning, formative assessments, project and performance assessments, as well as administering the district and state required standardized tests.

During the 2021 - 22 year:

- Wildlands had a 100% graduation rate. This continues the 17-year trend of 100% graduation.
- All seniors graduated, with all of them choosing to transition to post-secondary schooling being admitted to the school of their choice.
- The senior class of 10 students received in excess of \$200,000 in scholarships for attending various colleges, universities, and technical/vocational programs.
- All students in the high school at Wildlands participated in the formative assessment ePortfolio assessment and demonstrated evidence of learning program, as well as earning credits to progress to the next year.
- All high school students participated and passed two (1st and 2nd) semester final seminar presentations to staff, parents, and community members.
- Seniors all completed capstone senior projects with connections to real community issues and authentic project learning.
- The middle school students participated in the Wildlands program of formative and project-based assessment, with successful results.
- Wildlands middle school students for a fourth year participated in a comprehensive socio-emotional learning curriculum and assessment system to address whole-person learning in conjunction with traditional classroom content.

Achievement Summary

- Wildlands Charter School received an overall score of 65.4 on the DPI state report card for 2020-21. The school is rated as "Meets Expectations" at the state level.
- In the achievement in English and Language Arts area this school's score was the same or higher than 85.1% of 6-12 schools in the state.

In terms of school evaluation, student and parent surveys are conducted every year. Results from the 2021-22 school year were very favorable in terms of student and parent satisfaction, as well as academic preparation and matriculation to post-secondary institutions. All achievement metrics outlined in the charter contract for Wildlands School were met or exceeded during the 21-22 school year.

Wildlands operates as an instrumentality of the Augusta School District. The charter contract specifies the autonomies for the school in terms of finance as well as the responsibilities of both the authorizer and charter school in the financial performance category.

- The Wildlands budget was audited and approved during the summer 2022 school district audit.
- All specifications of the charter contract were met by both the authorizer and charter school.
