SECTION III: ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE OF CHARTER SCHOOLS

Insight School of Wisconsin (ISWI)

Designated as an at-risk, alternative accountability high school, Insight Wisconsin began in 2017 and is in its sixth year. As a school that serves students in need of intensive supports, Insight Wisconsin (ISWI) implements a 60:1 ratio in its student/mentor support network, designated English and math teachers, and counselors. The school academic programming continues to improve with personalization and relevance of academic curriculum. ISWI’s credit recovery programming, summer school and student engagement program design supports students through a successful mentoring program. ISWI includes additional credit recovery opportunities for students during the summer months, June through August, to assist students who could benefit from credit recovery options.

The Office of Educational Accountability (OEA) issued district report cards for 2022-2022 on November 15, 2022 and ISWI met satisfactory progress for alternative accountability goals in achievement.

Destinations Career Academy of Wisconsin (DCAWI)

Destinations Career Academy of Wisconsin (DCAWI) is a career-focused school with graduation requirements leading to industry certification, work experience, and post-secondary preparedness for career or college. DCA cultivates college and career readiness through purposeful educational experiences in a students chosen pathway with programs including but not exclusive to: Multi-tiered Systems of Support, Special Education, Project Based Learning (PBL), Work-based Learning, Early College Credit and Personalized Learning.

During the 22-23 school year, DCA offered 5 pathways for students and certification which included: Business, Construction, Health Sciences, Information Technology, and Law & Criminal Justice. An Agricultural Pathway is in the planning stages and will open enrollment in the fall of 2023. The 2019 4-year cohort graduation rate was 92%. Subsequently, the WIDCA 2019-2020 graduation rate was 81% and 2020-2021 rate was 90% and 2021-2022 was 92%.

The Office of Educational Accountability (OEA) issued district report cards for 2022-2022 on November 15, 2022. Destinations Career Academy scored 60, within the category of meeting expectations. Our current graduation rates are tracked and included below.

Wisconsin Virtual Academy High School (WIVA HS)

Wisconsin Virtual Academy High School is a general education public high school dedicated to providing K-12 students an enriching and personalized learning experience tailored to their needs. Wisconsin-licensed teachers develop Personalized Learning Plans for each student to

target their academic strengths and weaknesses. An engaging, highly interactive curriculum challenges students with courses in core subjects, art, music, world languages, electives, and AP®. Students are engaged in dozens of online clubs, as well as a National Honor Society and Student Council. Each spring an in-person prom and graduation are held.

In 2022, WIVA HS's 4-year cohort graduation rate was measured at 87% (see below). On November 15, 2022, The Office of Educational Accountability (OEA) issued district report cards for 2020-2021 in. WIVA HS scored 51.3, within the category of meeting few expectations.

The school has an added focus and emphasis on improving the school's graduation rate, as the state reported rate for 2022 was 20% below the state average (71.6%). WIVA High School is currently on a Continuous Improvement Plan (CIP) and is working closely with the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) to improve this rate. During the 2022-2023 school-year the school implemented a more robust Multi-tiered System of Support (MTSS). The research supported intervention, Check-and-Connect was implemented, along with other individualized interventions for over 500 students. Within this system a group of students who regularly not attend classes are deemed truant through a failure to participate process. When these students do not enroll in their resident school district or in another educational option, their enrollment remains with WIVA HS, thus negatively impacting WIVA High School's graduation rate. The 2022-23 school year has shown a large increase in Juniors and Seniors first enrolling in WIVA who are drastically credit deficient, leading us to shift resources to support our upper class students along with students who continue to struggle with academic engagement.

WIVA HS serves many students in the State of Wisconsin in need of alternative schooling and second chances, which can lead to a rating of lower than average for on-track readiness. With the interdisciplinary team implementing the MTSS larger growth is anticipated, including a decrease in the number of students withdrawn or dropping out and an increase in credit accumulation. While our internal data shows that the students who remain enrolled, and complete their high school education, have an estimated internal 85% graduation rate, we expect that with systematic interventions and systems to track student progress, students at-risk will join these ranks. Driven by our goals, WIVA HS continues to work on improving curricular options, instruction, student accountability, and teacher effectiveness to improve students' academic growth.

Wisconsin Virtual Academy (WIVA) K-8

In 2022, WIVA HS's 4-year cohort graduation rate was measured at 87% (see below). On November 15, 2022, The Office of Educational Accountability (OEA) issued district report cards for 2020-2021 in. WIVA K-8 scored 56.6 within the category of meets few expectations.

During the 2021-2022 school year, the student enrollment doubled, reaching over 2000 students. During the 2022-2023 school year enrollment remains consistent. The K5 school and MS both have principals focused on student engagement and achievement. Student mastery of standards is an area of positive, substantial shifts in practice and professional development for WIVA K-8. During the current school year, teachers are working toward full implementation of standards-based grading and reporting. Certified staff continue to increase collaborative efforts and data analysis skills in order that students' demonstration of knowledge and skill is more appropriately elicited and leveraged. Further academic achievement gains in math, English, science, and social studies are expected as all departments and staff are united in accountability for one year's growth of every student in one year's time.
