Section IV: Financial Performance of Charter Schools

Based on SAGES enrollment, including both resident and open enrollment students, as well as state and federal revenues received and fees collected that can be attributed to SAGES students, the school had revenues of \$1,298,878 for the 21-22 school year. As shown in the table in Section VII SAGES expenses were \$1,270,981. However, it should be pointed out that regular school day transportation to SAGES is not listed as an expense of the building. If SAGES were not a charter school we would not be transporting students from Waupun to SAGES. We are estimating the cost of added transportation at \$87,479. Additionally, the cost of district-level administration, maintenance, and insurance is not broken out by building. If these costs were prorated based on staff and student ratios that would add an additional \$183,528 of expense. These added costs would bring the total of operational expenses to \$1,541,988. With these factors taken into consideration, SAGES shows a net operating loss of \$243,110 for the 21-22 school year.
