ORDER OF THE STATE OF WISCONSIN NATURAL RESOURCES BOARD REPEALING, AMENDING, REPEALING AND RECREATING, AND CREATING RULES

The Wisconsin Natural Resources Board proposes an order to repeal NR 20.20(55)(e)3., 26.08(13)(a); to amend NR 20.20(3)(e)1., (11)(b), (12)(b)2., (13)(b), (17)(f), (22)(b)1., (25)(b)1., (27)(g)2., 3., (33)(am)1., (g)2., (42)(e), (53)(b)1., (56)(b), (61)(d)1., (62)(c)2., (64)(g)2., 4., (65)(a)1., (67)(ag)1., (as)1., (73)(a)4.a., 23.05(5)(intro.) and (e); to repeal and recreate 20.20(36); and to create NR 20.20(1)(cm), (18)(dm), (29)(cm), (50)(cm), (72)(cm), 26.08(35), 26.24(13), 26.33 relating to fishing on the inland, outlying, and boundary waters of Wisconsin.

Analysis Prepared by the Department of Natural Resources

Statutory Authority: Statutes that authorizes the promulgation of this rule order include ss. 23.09(2)(c), 29.014(1), 29.041, and 227.11(2), Stats. These sections grant rule making authority to the department to establish fish refuges, establish and maintain open and closed seasons for fish and game and any bag limits, size limits, rest days and conditions governing the taking of fish and game that will conserve the fish and game supply and ensure the citizens of this state continued opportunities for good fishing, hunting and trapping; that the department may regulate hunting and fishing on and in all interstate boundary waters, and outlying waters; and that all rules promulgated under this authority are subject to review under ch. 227, Stats.

Statutes Interpreted: In promulgating this rule, ss. 29.014(1) and 29.041, Stats., have been interpreted as giving the department the authority to make non-controversial housekeeping changes to fishing regulations to inland and boundary waters of Wisconsin.

Plain Language Rule Analysis: Section by section details of this rule order are outlined as follows:

Sections 1, 11, 16, and 27 increase the minimum length limit for muskellunge on the Wisconsin river from the Castle Rock dam (Adams/Juneau county) upstream through Wood county to the Dubay dam (Portage county) from 34-in to 45-in.

Sections 2 and 6 standardize trout regulations on Connors creek, Little Vance creek, South Fork Hay river, Upper Pine creek downstream from the Dallas flowage. The regulations currently change because they cross the Barron/Dunn county line and the county base regulations are different. Vance creek is currently category 2 in both counties, but its tributaries that come together in the same area are category 4 and should be changed for consistency. The bag limit for trout will be reduced from 5 in total to 3 in total and the minimum length limit will be increased from 7-in for all trout to 8-in for brook trout and 12-in for brown and rainbow trout on Connors creek, Little Vance creek, South Fork Hay river, Upper Pine creek downstream from the Dallas flowage, and Vance creek in Barron County.

Sections 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 17, and 19 reduce the daily bag limit from 25 in total to 10 in total for catfish on the Lower Wisconsin river from the Wisconsin Dells dam in Columbia and Sauk counties downstream through Dane, Iowa, Richland, Grant and Crawford counties.

Section 6 removes the size restrictions for trout on Knapp pond in Dunn county.

Section 7 reduces the daily bag limit for panfish from 25 in total to 10 in total on Lake Altoona, Eau Claire County.

Section 10 standardizes trout regulations that currently change only because they cross the Trempealeau/Jackson county line. The bag limit for trout will be reduced from 5 in total to 3 in total and the minimum length limit will be increased from 7-in to 9-in on Big Slough creek and Schermerhorn creek, Jackson County. The bag limit for trout will be reduced from 5 in total to 3 in total and the minimum

length limit will be increased from 7-in for all trout to 8-in for brook trout and 12-in for brown and rainbow trout on Washington Coulee creek, Jackson County.

Section 12 increases the harvest slot limit for catfish on Yellowstone lake in Lafayette County from a minimum of 12-in and maximum of 15-in to a minimum of 15-in and a maximum of 18-in.

Section 13 increases the harvest slot limit for walleye, sauger and hybrids on Yellowstone lake in Lafayette County from a minimum of 12-in and maximum of 15-in to a minimum of 15-in and a maximum of 18-in.

Section 14 increases the minimum length limit from 14-in to 18-in and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 1 in total for bass; reduces the daily bag limit from 25 in total to 10 in total for panfish; and increases the minimum length limit from 15-in to 18-in and reduces the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 3 in total for walleye on Silver lake, Manitowoc County.

Section 15 standardizes trout regulations that currently change only because they cross the Monroe/Jackson county line. The bag limit for trout will be reduced from 5 in total to 3 in total and the minimum length limit will be increased from 7-in to 9-in on Clear creek and Ranch creek, Monroe County.

Section 18 reduces the minimum length limit from 18-in to 15-in and increases the daily bag limit from 3 in total to 5 in total for walleye, sauger and hybrids (reverts back to statewide regulations) in Sand lake, Rusk County.

Section 20 eliminates the no minimum length limit with a 14-in to 18-in protected slot for walleye, sauger and hybrids and reverts back to the statewide 15-in minimum length limit on Rib lake, Taylor County.

Section 21 standardizes trout regulations that currently change only because they cross the Buffalo/Trempealeau county line. The bag limit for trout will be reduced from 5 in total to 3 in total and the minimum length limit will be increased from 7-in to 9-in on Kilness creek and Sport Valley creek in Trempealeau County. This section also standardizes trout regulations that currently change only because they cross the Eau Claire/Trempealeau county line. The bag limit for trout will be reduced from 5 in total to 3 in total and the minimum length limit will be increased from 7-in to 9-in on Lindsay creek, Big creek, and Pine creek, Trempealeau County.

Sections 22 and 23 increase the minimum length limit from 26-in to 30-in for lake trout on Black Oak lake, Vilas County.

Section 24 allows motor trolling county-wide in Walworth County.

Sections 25 and 26 increase the minimum length limit from 14-in to 18-in and decrease the daily bag limit from 5 in total to 1 in total for bass and reduce the daily bag limit from 25 in total to 10 in total for panfish on Erler lake, Washington County.

Section 28 eliminates motor trolling on the Wolf river from its mouth at Lake Poygan upstream to the dam in the city of Shawano, and all its tributaries upstream to the first dam, including Cincoe and Partridge lakes in Winnebago, Waupaca, Outagamie and Shawano counties.

Section 29 increases the minimum length limit for muskellunge from 40-in to 50-in on the Menominee river (Wisconsin/Michigan boundary waters) from the Hattie Street dam downstream to eastern end of the breakwalls in Green Bay.

Sections 30 and 33 extend the duration of the Wingra creek refuge that currently ends on the first Friday in May so as to be open for the general fishing season opener to May 15 to ensure muskellunge are no longer concentrated below the spillway.

Section 31 establishes new fish refuges from March 1 to the opening day of the general gamefish season on the Little Somo river and the Tomahawk river in Lincoln County.

Section 33 establishes three new fish refuges from April 1 through April 15 on the Little Wolf river in Waupaca county.

Federal Regulatory Analysis: Provided state rules and statutes do not relieve individuals from the restrictions, requirements and conditions of Federal statutes and regulations, regulation of fishing for native species has been delegated to state fish and wildlife agencies. No federal regulations regarding seasons, bag limits and size limits have been drafted or implemented. Additionally, none of the proposed rules exceed the authorities granted the states in 50 CFR 10.

State Regulatory Analysis: Fisheries management is generally quite similar in the states surrounding Wisconsin. All the bordering states regulate fishing by the use of seasons, bag limits and size limits. Specific seasons, bag and size limits may differ for species across the surrounding states; however, the general principles are similar. Michigan, Minnesota, Iowa and Illinois all have statewide seasons, bag and size limits for fish species, along with special or experimental regulations on individual waters.

SECTION 34. EFFECTIVE DATE. This rule shall take effect on April 1, 2005, except sections 2, 6, 10, 15, 21, 22, and 23, which shall take effect on March 1, 2005, as provided in s. 227.22(2)(intro.), Stats.

SECTION 35. BOARD ADOPTION. This rule was approved and adopted by the State of Wisconsin Natural Resources Board on May 26, 2004.
