The Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations., the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations hereby proposes to amend ILHR 145 (title) and ILHR 145.01.

Statutory Authority: ss. 101.02(1), 108.14(2) and 227.22(2), Stats

Statutes Interpreted: s. 108.02(15)(k)14

ANALYSIS:

Under s.108.02(15)(k)14, Stats., an individual who works for a processing employer, exclusively within that employer's active processing season, is not eligible for unemployment compensation benefits unless certain conditions are met. Chapter ILHR 145 changes the word "canning" to "processing" to accurately reflect current law, corrects statutory references and updates the outside limits of the active processing season for the crops grown in Wisconsin. This rule specifies which fruits and vegetables are considered "fresh perishable" within the meaning of s. 108.02(15)(k)14, Stats.

SECTION 1. Chapter ILHR 145 (title) is amended to read:

SECTION 2. ILHR 145.01 (title) and ILHR 145.01 are amended to read:

ILHR 145.01 (title) ACTIVE PROCESSING SEASONS.

(1) The department hereby determines that For purposes of s. 108.02(15)(k)14., Stats., the outside limits beginning and end of active canning processing seasons for all employers engaged in the canning processing of fresh perishable fruits or vegetables in Wisconsin occur entirely between during the following specified dates weeks each year:

(2) Of those the fruits and vegetables canned processed commercially in Wisconsin, only those fruits or vegetables listed in sub.(1) are "fresh perishable", within the meaning of $\frac{108.02(5)(g)22}{5tats}$. Stats. s.108.02(15)(k)14, Stats.

(3) In determining the eligibility of any given an employe under $\frac{108.02(5)(g)22}{g}$ Stats. <u>s.108.02(15)(k)14</u>, Stats, the department deputy under s.108.09, Stats, shall in any contested claim and may in any claim determine between what dates, (within the limits imposed by sub (1)), the active canning processing season or seasons actually occurred in the establishment in which the employe was employed.

This rule shall take effect on the first day of the month following publication in the Wisconsin administrative register as provided in s. 227 22(2)(intro.), Stats.
