

entitled to all the rights and privileges which other towns, are by law entitled to. The first election in said town, shall be holden at the house of Morgan L. Bartlett, on the second Tuesday of April next.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.
APPROVED, February 22, 1845.

AN ACT to authorize the County Commissioners of Washington County to construct and maintain certain bridges across Milwaukee river.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin:

SECTION 1. That it shall, and may be lawful for the county commissioners of Washington county, to construct all necessary bridges across the Milwaukee river within said county, and to keep up and maintain such bridges as are now constructed across said river in said county as public bridges: *Provided*, however that no bridge built, or to be built, under the provisions of this act, shall be so construed [constructed] as to hinder the free navigation of said river, by any craft that may navigate the same, or any raft that shall not exceed twenty feet in width.

SEC. 2. This act shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage, and may be altered, amended or repealed by any future legislature.

APPROVED, February 8, 1845.

AN ACT to organize certain towns.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin.

SECTION 1. That the south half of township numbered twelve, and the north half of township numbered eleven in ranges number thirteen and fourteen east, shall hereafter be known by the name of Beaver Dam, and that said tract of country is hereby incorporated for the purpose of holding property for public uses, and for no other purpose.

SEC. 2. That township number ten north in range number sixteen and seventeen east, be, and is hereby set off into a separate town to be known by the name of Hustisford.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

APPROVED, February 24, 1845.

AN ACT to change the form of government in the county of Marquette.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin:

SECTION 1. That the county system of government is hereby established in the county of Marquette, and for the purpose of organizing said system of government, the legal voters of said county may assemble at the several precincts hereinafter established, on the first Monday in April next, for the choice of all county officers which any county in this Territory may by law elect: *Provided*, however, that no two of the county commissioners for said county, shall be elected from any one precinct.

SEC. 2. The officers thus elected, shall severally hold their offices until the first Monday of January next, and until others are duly elected and qualified in their stead.

SEC. 3. There shall be three election precincts established in said county, as follows: and the places of holding all elections therein shall be as herein established, until otherwise changed, according to law, to wit: one precinct at Green Lake, to be known as the Green Lake precinct, wherein elections shall be held at the house of William Baseley; also, a precinct shall be established near Little Green Lake, to be known as Little Green Lake precinct, and the place of elections shall be at the house of Henry C. Jewel; a precinct shall also be established at Lake Maria, to be called Lake Maria precinct, and the place of elections shall be at the house of Sawyer Carter.

SEC. 4. The clerk of the town of Marquette is hereby required to post up election notices for the first election, at two or more
