

AN ACT for the relief of John J. Driggs.

BE IT ENACTED by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin:

SECTION 1. That the marriage contract heretofore existing between John J. Driggs and his wife Susan Driggs, be and the same is hereby dissolved, and the said John J. Driggs is hereby restored to all the rights and privileges of an unmarried man.

APPROVED, January 22, 1846.

AN ACT to authorize certain persons to build a dam across Milwaukee river.

BE IT ENACTED by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin:

SECTION 1. That the owners of the northwest quarter of section number thirty-six and the south west quarter of section twenty-five township No. eleven, in range No. twenty-one, in Washington county, their successors and assigns, be, and they are hereby authorized to erect and maintain a dam across Milwaukee river at such points on the aforesaid tracts of land, as they may deem most suitable, and to make use of the water for hydraulic purposes.

SEC. 2. Said dam shall not exceed six feet in height above high water mark of said river, and said proprietors shall construct and keep in good repair a sufficient chute not less than fifteen feet wide and so constructed as not to cause a fall of more than three feet to every twelve feet of smooth surface to admit of the passage of all rafts of timber down said stream.

SEC. 3. The said dam shall be subject to all the provisions of an act of the legislature of this Territory entitled "an act in relation to mills and mill dams," approved 13th January, 1840.

SEC. 4. The legislature, may at any time amend, alter or repeal this act.

SEC. 5. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

AN ACT to vacate certain streets in the village of Geneva.

BE IT ENACTED by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin:

SECTION 1. That Pike street and Illinois street in the village of Geneva, be, and the same are hereby vacated and discontinued.

AN ACT to legalize the acts of the officers therein named.

BE IT ENACTED by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin:

SECTION 1. That the special election held in the county of Portage for county commissioners, and clerk, on the 25th day of March, 1845, shall be as valid as if the proper notice had been
