AN ACT

To provide for taking the depositions of persons out of the territory to be used before justices of the peace.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin:

Depositions
how taken.

SECTION 1. That the depositions of persons out of the territory of Wisconsin, to be used in cases before justices of the peace, within this territory, may be taken in the same manner, and under the same regulations as depositions are now authorized by law to be taken of persons within this territory, and shall be subject to the same exceptions: *Provided*, that in no case shall more than forty days' notice of the taking such depositions be required to be given to the adverse party.

Depositions
how used.

SEC. 2. In cases of appeals from any decision or judgment of a justice of the peace, the deposition taken under this, or any other law of the territory, and used before the justice on the trial before him, may be used in the court to which such appeal shall be taken, in the same manner, and subject to

such exception for informality, or irregularity, and none others, as were taken to said depositions in writing, before the trial, in the justices court where the same were used.

AN ACT

To authorize school district No. 1, in Richmond, and 6, in Johnstown, to renew a tax warrant, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Council and House of Representatives of the Territory of Wisconsin:

SECTION 1. That the trustees of joint school district number one, in the town of Richmond, Walworth county, and number six, in the town of Johnstown, Rock county, are hereby authorized to renew a tax warrant, issued for the collection of one hundred and eighty-five dollars, which was ordered to be raised at their last annual meeting, for the purpose of building a school house.

SEC. 2. The acts of the commissioners of schools in organizing the school district named in the first section of this act, are hereby sanctioned and legalized.
