## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2021 AB 504 makes changes to requirements for water supply service area plans for public water supply systems. The bill changes, among other things, who is required to have a plan, plan content requirements, the responsibility of a designated areawide water quality planning agency, and the criteria for DNR approval of the plan. 2021 AB 504 includes language indicating that a plan does not obligate a water utility to provide service to the area delineated or covered in the plan. It also prohibits the Public Service Commission from requiring a water utility to extend or provide service to an area on the basis of the provisions of the plan.

There is no state or local fiscal effect.
