## **Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate**

The Department of Corrections (DOC) is currently able to reimburse counties for certain expenses related to actions or proceedings involving persons in our care (PIOC) in state prisons or juvenile correctional facilities. This bill expands statutory language to also require DOC to reimburse counties, cities, villages, or towns that provide law enforcement investigative services for incidents involving PIOCs in a state prison or juveniles in a juvenile correctional facility.

The Department is currently reimbursing the Village of Allouez and Dodge County for these costs, but the bill would allow other municipalities to also submit reimbursement claims.

The bill establishes that these claims should be reimbursed out of two sum sufficient appropriations: s.20.410(1)(c) and s.20.410(3)(c). Because both of these appropriations are sum sufficient, the State would be required to cover any costs that exceed the authorized budgetary amount in a given fiscal year.
