Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires the Department of Health Services to establish an Office of Violence Prevention. The bill specifies several responsibilities for the office related to coordinating and expanding violence prevention activities, including implementing a grant program for local communities and developing sources of funding to support the office. The Department would require position authority and funding for the office to carry out these responsibilities. One could assume the office would require a Director, Executive Staff Assistant, two Program and Policy Analysts, two Grant Specialists and two Financial Specialists for a total of 561,400 GPR in salary and fringe costs and 8 FTE GPR annually. In addition, ongoing office costs for the 8 FTE are estimated at \$88,800 GPR annually, for a total of \$649,400 GPR in annual staffing costs. However, the Department may identify additional staff needs once the office is established.

In addition, the bill directs the office to establish a grant program to support violence reduction in local communities. Costs of the grant program are indeterminate depending on the activities of the office.

Costs for supplies, services and other office set up costs is estimated at a one-time cost of \$20,000 GPR
