Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill modifies the identification of what constitutes a "youth center" for the purpose of supervised release of sexually violent persons who have successfully petitioned the court for supervised release. Under current law, a "youth center" is defined

as a center that regularly provides recreational, vocational, academic, or social services activities for persons under 18. This bill adds that "youth center" also includes private property on which recreational, vocational, academic, or social services activities are regularly provided for persons under 18. As a result, the bill expands the type of facilities from which a placement of a sexually violent person requires a minimum distance of 1,500 feet.

The bill also requires local law enforcement to notify private residences within 1,500 feet of the approved residences that the person will be placed there. Local units of government may incur additional costs to comply with the bill; however, under the bill the Department of Health Services is required to reimbursement local governments for the cost of the notices.
