Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This fiscal estimate is submitted by the Director of the State Prosecutors Office on behalf of Agency 475 – District Attorneys. This fiscal estimate is responsive only to the fiscal and resource effect of the proposed legislation on the District Attorney program.

Under this bill, when a court makes a sentencing decision concerning a person who is a military veteran and has been diagnosed as suffering from post-traumatic stress disorder resulting from the person's military service, the court may consider that diagnosis as a mitigating factor.

Under current law, Wis. Stat. s 973.017(2)(b) directs the court to consider any applicable mitigating factors when making a sentencing decision. Responsive District Attorneys do not anticipate that delineating this mitigating factor in statute will have any fiscal impact on their offices.
