Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill contains three main provisions impacting DPI's work related to the school and school district accountability reports (i.e., "report cards"):

- 1. This bill requires DPI, for school and school district report cards published for the 2021-22 school year, to use the measures, index system, and other components, methods, and formulas that DPI used to publish the school and school district report cards for the 2018-19 school year.
- 2. Going forward, DPI may change the measures, index system, and other components, methods, and formulas that DPI uses only by promulgating rules.
- 3 The bill also specifies that, in determining a school's overall score on a school report card, DPI may not give more weight to measures of growth in pupil achievement in reading and mathematics than to measures of actual pupil achievement in reading and mathematics.

The first provision would require that staff in DPI's Office of Education Accountability (OEA) dedicate a significant amount of time to implement programming changes necessary to produce the report cards for the 2021-22 school year as specified under the bill (cost indeterminate).

The second provision (if utilized) would require significant staff time (the OEA, DPI's Administrative Rules Coordinator, DPI's Office of Legal Services, etc.) to promulgate a rule (cost indeterminate).

The third provision would again require OEA staff time to make changes necessary to comply with the bill's requirement (cost indeterminate).
