Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

SB 157 creates a \$121,000 annual grant program in which the Wisconsin Technical College System (WTCS) Board and the Higher Education Aids Board may award grants of up to \$1,500 to students who are enrolled in WTCS and tribal college courses associated with a state approved apprenticeship program. The grants are awarded to help students pay for actual material expenses associated with their apprenticeship training program including the cost of purchasing tools, clothing, equipment and supplies. The bill requires the WTCS Board to establish an application process and criteria for awarding the grants.

The WTCS Board and WTCS Districts (i.e., colleges) will incur minor costs related to the development of the application process, marketing of the scholarship to eligible students, evaluation of applications and selection of recipients. The WTCS Board and WTCS Districts plan to absorb these costs.
