Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill allows the Wisconsin Lottery to participate in Powerball should the Multi-State Lottery Association enter into an agreement with another country outside of what is listed in current law.

The fiscal effect is indeterminate as it depends on potential future changes to the Powerball game.

If the Powerball game is expanded for use in other countries, the Wisconsin Lottery would no longer be able to sell the Powerball game under current law. This would result in decrease in lottery proceeds available for property tax relief. Of the \$237,442,100 of lottery proceeds that were certified for property tax relief in FY21, approximately \$15,263,700 was generated by Powerball.

Selling Powerball in additional countries should result in higher sales, increasing the amount of money available for property tax relief compared to current law.
