Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

The bill requires the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources to waive park admission fees for parents or guardians of children who provide proof of enrollment in the National Parks "Every Kid Outdoors" program for 4th graders.

I. Assumptions

- A. In Fiscal Year 2018-19, the Department posted \$8,801,307 in resident annual and resident daily vehicle admission fee revenues that were distributed to both the forestry and parks accounts of the conservation fund;
- B. According to the U.S. Census Bureau (USCB), there were an estimated 2,358,156 households in Wisconsin in 2019;
- C. According to the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI), there were 70,424 4th graders enrolled in both public and private schools for the 2015-16 academic school year, the most recent year for which combined public and private enrollment data is available (source: DPI Public Enrollment Master and Private School Enrollment Report);
- D. Based on the prior two assumptions, an estimated 3.0% of Wisconsin households have a child enrolled in the 4th grade (70,424 enrolled 4th graders/2,358,156 households = 0.02986)

II. State Fiscal Impact-Revenue

- A. If 30% of 4th grade households access the waiver and visit department properties requiring a vehicle admission fee, the estimated annual reduction in admission fee revenue would be \$79,200 (\$8,801,307 x 3% of households x 30% opt-in).
- B. If 100% of 4th grade households opt for the waiver, the estimated annual reduction in admission fee revenue would be $$264,000 (\$8,801,307 \times 3\% \text{ of households}).$
- C. Given the aforementioned two scenarios, the bill could reduce admission fee revenue from \$79,200 to \$264,000 per year. Notwithstanding this range, the Department characterizes the overall revenue impact as indeterminate since it is difficult to accurately estimate the percentage of 4th grade households that would opt for the waiver.

III. State Fiscal Impact-Expenses

A. One-Time Costs

Procedures will need to be developed and implemented to track waiver requests and maintain a database of admissions that qualify under the bill requirements. One-time implementation costs for these procedures are estimated at \$2,500.

B. Ongoing Costs

It is estimated a half-time limited term employee would be needed to process requests, track total fees waived, and analyze and maintain data. Assuming an LTE wage/fringe of \$19.00/hour translates to an estimated annual cost of \$10,000.
