#### Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires the Department of Justice to accept and provide access to filings of critical incident mapping data, in addition to blueprints, from private and public schools, and to establish a grant program that provides funding for public and private schools to comply with the critical incident mapping data submission requirement. The grant funding must be used by schools for site-specific critical incident mapping data and the data shall be compatible with existing platforms and applications used by local, state and federal public safety officials. The department is further required to submit an annual report to the Joint Committee on Finance on the grant awards and expenditures.

The bill creates a new continuing GPR appropriation and specifies that the department may submit a request to the Joint Committee on Finance to provide up to \$2 million GPR during the biennium to fund the grants.

In order to provide technical assistance to schools in complying with the filing requirement, award and administer grants, provide grant reporting, and modify the school safety information system to allow for the submission and provision of critical incident mapping data, the department requires 1.0 full-time equivalent position during the term of the grant program. Because the amount of funding provided for the grant is not specified, the estimate assumes that a \$2 million grant program will take up to four years to complete and close over multiple school-year grant award cycles, but a lower amount of funding could be administered in two or three years over a single award cycle.

#### Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The fiscal estimate assumes a one-time supplement of grant award funding administered over a period of four years with no on-going funding.
