## Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

This bill requires the Department of Health Service to reimburse ambulance service providers for epinephrine and allows drugs prescribed to counteract anaphylaxis to be substituted with an equivalent under certain circumstances. Due to the maintenance of effort requirements of the federal Consolidated Appropriations Act for the federal American Rescue Plan Act, it would also provide additional funding to the Department of Public Instruction for special education, the UW System, and technical college system.

## Long-Range Fiscal Implications

The UW System's general program operations appropriation would be increased by \$25,500 in 2021-22 and 2022-23. The funding would be used for strategic initiatives identified by the President and Board of Regents.
