Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

2021 SB 760 requires the Public Service Commission to consider the social cost of carbon in determining whether to issue certificates required to construct large electric generating facilities or high-voltage transmission lines or to engage in certain other public utility projects. The social cost of carbon is defined as the measure of the economic harms and other impacts expressed in dollars that result from emitting one ton of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere. 2021 SB 760 sets the social cost of carbon at \$50 per ton of carbon dioxide emitted into the atmosphere. The bill also requires the Commission, in consultation with the Department of Natural Resources, to annually evaluate the social cost of carbon and adjust as necessary, consistent with the international consensus. There would be no fiscal effects to the Commission as a result of this bill.
