Assumptions Used in Arriving at Fiscal Estimate

Under the proposed, the Elections Commission, or Commission, is required to submit an annual report to the Joint Committee on Finance (JFC) and the Department of Administration (Department), that describes any failures of the Commission, the Departments of Transportation (DOT), Corrections (DOC), and Health Services (DHS), to comply with elections related laws in the preceding 12 months from 15 days after each spring election.

No later than 10 days after the report is received, the Department's Secretary would be required to submit a request under s. 13.101 (18), Wis. Stats., to JFC that includes: either a request to abolish full-time equivalent (FTE) positions from the Commission, DOT, DOC and/or DHS, or to maintain the existing level of FTE under each; and either to lapse funding to the general fund from general purpose revenue (GPR) from DOC, DHS, and/or the Commission and/or from transportation funds from DOT, or maintain the existing funding levels under each. If JFC determined that any of the agencies or commission had failed to comply with the election laws, they would be permitted to lapse from an appropriation to the general fund up to \$50,000 for each day of noncompliance/erroneous guidance.

The Department would be required to develop the report for submission to JFC on any failures to comply with elections-related laws and recommendations to abolish positions and/or lapse funding. The effort to develop the report after each spring election would be absorbable into currently existing staffing workloads and position and budget authority.

The Department is not able to ascertain the occurrence of the citation of failures and recommendation of lapse of moneys and/or positions, nor approval by JFC via a s. 13.10. If this were to occur, the Department's Division of Executive Budget and Finance would be responsible for processing and approving the lapse(s) and/or position deletion(s), and for which efforts are anticipated to be absorbed by existing staffing workloads and position and budget authority.
