

Chap 101 An act to organize the town of Chili, in Fond du Lac county.

THE people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly do enact as follows :

Chili.

SECTION 1. All that portion of the town of Auburn, in Fond du Lac county, which is contained in township number thirteen north of range number eighteen east, is hereby set off from the town of Auburn and organized into a separate town by the name of Chili, and the first town meeting shall be held at the house of William Boner, on the first Tuesday of April next.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect on the first Tuesday of April next:

Chap 102 An act to change the name of the village of Milford, in Green county.

THE People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Attica.

SECTION 1. That the name of the village of Milford, in Green county, be and the same is hereby changed to Attica, by which name said village shall hereafter be known in all courts and places.

Chap 103 An act to repeal an act to change the boundaries of the towns of Utica and Rushford, in Winnebago county.

THE People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The act entitled "an act to change the boundaries of the towns of Utica and Rushford in the county of Winnebago," approved August 21st, 1848, is hereby repealed.
