Rule of evidence

SEC. 18. This act shall be favorably construed to effect the purposes thereby intended in all courts and places and the same is hereby declared to be a public act and copies thereof printed by authority of the state shall be received as evidence of all provisions herein contained, and shall be binding upon said company from and after the time when the President and directors of said company chosen under their former organisation shall have filed their certificate of the acceptance of this act in the office of the Secretary of State.

Chap. 243

An Act to exempt certain persons from paying a poll tax.

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Poll tax exemption.

SECTION 1. The commissioned and non-commissioned officers, musicians and privates of each organized company of artillery, light infantry, riflemen or cavalry, which is now or shall hereafter be formed pursuant to chapter twenty-five, title nine, part first of the Revised Statutes, shall be exempt from paying a poll tax.

Chap. 244

An Act to declare a certain road in the village of Hazel Green a public highway.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

§ Road declared public highway.

SECTION 1. That so much of the road leading through the village of Hazel Green in the county of Grant, commencing on the north line of lot number two (2,) in block number three (3,) in lower Hazel Green, running thence nearly north to the southeast corner of the north-west quarter of section twenty-five, in town one north, range one west of the fourth principal meridi-

an, be and the same is hereby declared to be a legal public highway.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

An Act to authorise the people of School District composed of parts of the towns of Porter and Union in the county of Rock, and parts of the town of Dunkirk in the county of Dane, to build a school house on the public square, in the village of Waucoma in the town of Porter.

Chap. 245

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That school district known as part district number five (5,) in the town of Porter, and part district number seven (7,) in the town of Union in the county of Rock, and as part district number eight (8,) in the town of Dunkirk in the county of Dane, be, and said district is hereby authorised and empowered to build a good and substantial school house on the public square in the village of Waucoma, in the county of Rock.

Authority to build school house.

SEC. 2. The legal voters of said school district shall, at any special meeting called for that purpose, after ten days' previous notice thereof, determine the precise location of said school house on said public square, and shall also determine by ballot the size and dimensions, and the cost of said house, and when so determined, the proper officers of said school district shall cause said school house herein authorised to be built to be begun and be completed as early as practicable, and said school house, when so built and constructed, shall be and remain the property of said school district and subject to all the laws in relation to school houses in other districts in this State.

Legal voters shall determine precise location, &c.

Proper officers to cause house to be built.

SEC. 3. This act shall take effect from and after its passage.

An Act to authorise the laying out of a State Road in the counties of Jefferson and Waukesha.

Chap. 246

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That William W. Treadway, Lester Gifford, Appointment of Commissioners
