The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Notice of intended application to be given.

SECTION 1. That no State road shall be granted by the legislature, unless it shall appear that notice has been given of the intention to apply for the same, by the publication of a notice to that effect, four weeks successively, in some newspaper in such county, through which it is proposed to lay such road: Provided, that if there should be no newspaper published in

notice to that effect, four weeks successively, in some newspaper in such county, through which it is proposed to lay such road: Provided, that if there should be no newspaper published in any county, it shall be lawful to give such notice by printing the same, at three or more of the public places, near the line of said proposed road, for the term of four weeks.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect from and after the present session of the legislature.

river, to a point on the Wisconsin river called the Elbow of Route. the Dells, thence by way of the Lemonware Valley to Prairie

La Crosse on the Mississippi river in La Crosse county.

SEC. 2. Jacob Spaulding, Skyler Gates, and C. B. Strong commissioners are hereby appointed Commissioners to lay out and establish a out Road. state road from Black River Falls to the point on the Wisconsin Route. river in Adams county, where the road mentioned in the first section of this act crosses the same.

SEC. 3. If any of the Commissioners appointed by this Commissioners act shall by any cause be unable to perform the duties hereby stitutes required, then and in such case they are hereby authorised to appoint a substitute: Provided that no part of the expense of Proviso. laying out said roads shall be paid out of the State treasury.
