

An Act to pay to Wm. Doughty the principal and interest due in five bonds issued by the Territory of Wisconsin. **Chap. 291**

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to William Doughty, of Georgetown, D. C., out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, payable on the first day of June next, the following sums, to wit:

For five bonds of one thousand dollars each, due on the 20th of June, A. D. 1851. Five thousand dollars, also, for eleven months' interest, sixty dollars and sixty cents. Payment for Bonds.

Also: for twenty coupons, for thirty-five dollars each, five of which are due each Dec. 20th 1849, June 20th 1850, Dec. 20th 1850, and June 20th 1851, seven hundred dollars. Payment for Coupons.

Also: for interest due on said coupons, thirty-six dollars and seventy-four cents. Payment for Interest.

Also: for exchange on Bank of America, New York, where such bonds and coupons are payable, sixty-nine dollars and ninety-six cents. Payment for Exchange.

SEC. 2. It shall be the duty of the treasurer on the payment of this appropriation, to take up and cancel said bonds and coupons. Treasurer to cancel bonds &c

An Act providing for the appointment of Commissioners to review and survey a Territorial Road therein named. **Chap. 292**

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Jameson Hamilton, of the county of La Fayette, William Bateman, of the county of Iowa, and Benjamin Denson, of the county of Dane, are hereby appointed commissioners, and vested with powers to review and survey an old Territorial road commencing at the village of Shullsburgh in said county of La Fayette and running to the Blue Mounds in the county of Dane aforesaid, via Avon, Darlington, Cox's Mills on Otter Creek, Fayette, Parkinson's Mills in Yellow Stone Creek, R. G. Scott's store, William Bateman's farm, and thence to the Blue Mounds, there to intersect the road leading from Madison to Mineral Point, said road being the same that was surveyed by one Hugh R. Hunter. Commissioners appointed to review and survey road.
Route.

Variations may
be made.

SEC. 2. Said Commissioners are hereby also authorized to make such trifling variations in said road from the original survey, as may be by them deemed necessary.

State not to pay
expense.

SEC. 3. No compensation for services rendered under the provisions of this act, shall ever be claimed of or paid by this State.

Briggs, a murderer.
