

Chap. 343 An Act to legalize the Acts of the officers of School District No. 1, in the town of Springfield, Dane County.

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. The acts of the officers of school district number one in the town of Springfield, Dane county, for the years A. D. eighteen hundred and forty-nine and eighteen hundred and fifty, are hereby declared legal, and the several acts of the Trustees and other officers of said district shall not be deemed invalid in consequence of any informality or defect in the election of said officers.

Chap. 344 An Act to repeal a part of an act entitled "An Act to incorporate the Wisconsin Bridge Company."

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. That so much of the fourth section of an act entitled "an Act to incorporate the Wisconsin Bridge Company," approved March second, eighteen hundred and forty-nine, be amended so as to read as follows. to wit: "And no other bridge shall be constructed over said stream within two and a half miles of said bridge for the term of three years after the passage of this act."

Chap. 345 An Act to provide for laying out a State road from Franklin in the county of Iowa to intersect the State road at or near Round Prairie in the county of Bad Axe.
