SEC. 17. This act shall be favorably construed to effect the purposes thereby intended, and the same is hereby declared to be a public act, and copies thereof printed by authority of the State, shall be received as evidence thereof. Rule of evidence.

SEC. 18. This act may be altered or amended by any future legislature of the State of Wisconsin.

An Act to authorise School District Number Four in the town of Waldwic, Iowa County, to draw its proportion of School monies for eighteen hundred and fifty. Chap. 385

The People of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

SECTION 1. It shall be lawful for school district number four in the town of Waldwic in the county of Iowa, to draw its proportion of school monies for the year eighteen hundred and fifty, in the same manner and to the same effect as is now provided by law, notwithstanding such district may not have hitherto complied with all the provisions of law to enable it to draw the same. Chap. 387 An Act to vacate a part of the Territorial Road in Dodge county, surveyed by Victor M. Adams, under the direction of Isaac Noys and Benjamin Clason, commissioners, and established by an Act of the Territorial Legislature, approved February 22nd, 1845.

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Road vacated.

SECTION 1. So much of a Territorial road as was surveyed by Victor M. Adams, under the supervision of Isaac Noys and Benjamin Clason, commissioners, established by an act of the Territorial legislature, approved February 22nd, 1845, as runs through the lands of Stephen Drown, J. C. Hurd, M. B. Hall, Durkee Lyon, and Isaac Noys, in the county of Dodge, be and the same is hereby vacated and discontinued.

When to take effect.

SEC. 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.

Chap. 388.

An Act concerning sales for taxes

The People of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows :

Lands bid off for the County subject to taxation and sale

SECTION 1. Section ninety-four of chapter fifteen of title five of the revised statutes is hereby amended, so that it shall hereafter read as follows: All lands bid off for the county, as provided in the preceding section, shall continue liable to be taxed in the same manner as if such sale had not been made, and upon every return of such lands as delinquent to the county treasurer, they shall be subject to sale under the statute regulations the same as all other lands which may be returned as delinquent, and sold for the taxes and charges thereon. Provided, that if such lands are sold to any individual or individuals, at any subsequent tax sale or tax sales, the title which may
