

Milwaukee Horticultural Society, for the purpose of encouraging and improving the science and practice of horticulture, and the promoting the propagation of the various species of trees, fruits, plants, and vegetables, and the introduction of new species and varieties, and for no other purpose whatever.

Powers.

Sec. 2. That said Milwaukee Horticultural Society shall have power to adopt a constitution and by-laws, not inconsistent with the laws of this state, for the regulation of the society; to receive donations and bequests for promoting its objects; to levy and collect assessments on the members, and enforce the collection of the same by suit; to purchase, receive, occupy, hold, and convey any real or personal estate which may be necessary to carry out the objects of the association, (provided the same shall not exceed the sum of ten thousand dollars); to elect officers and appoint agents to transact their business; to manage and apply the funds, discharge the functions, and promote the objects thereof; and to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded in any court in this state and to use a corporate seal.

Who to call first meeting.

Sec. 3. That any five of the persons named in the first section of this act shall have power to call the first meeting of the corporators and organize the corporation.
