An Act to organize the county of Waushara for judicial purposes.

Chap. 34.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. From and after the first day of March next  
 When organized the county of Waushara shall be fully organized for judicial purposes, and shall enjoy all the rights and privileges appertaining to other counties so organized in this state.

SEC. 2. Said county of Waushara shall be, and is hereby  
 Made part of constituted a part of the third judicial circuit; and third circuit. two terms of the circuit court shall be holden annually in said county, at the county seat thereof, to wit: on the first Monday of April, and the second Monday of October annually. There shall be four terms of the county court annually in said county, to wit: on the first Mondays in April, July, October, and January.

SEC. 3. All writs shall issue and be made returnable  
 How writs re- as required by law in other counties; and all laws now turnable. in force, applicable to the summoning and empanneling of jurors shall be applicable to, and in force in the said county of Waushara.

SEC. 4. This act to be in force from and after the first day of March, 1852.
