

of any such lands, and pay the money so received into the treasury of this state.

SEC. 4. It shall be the duty of the governor to ascertain and select all the swamp and overflowed lands granted to this state by act aforesaid, already surveyed and not heretofore selected and approved by the authorities of the United States, or as may be hereafter surveyed from time to time, and cause entries thereof to be made in the name of the state of Wisconsin at the proper land offices of the United States, and to procure suitable books for the state, and to cause to be recorded therein descriptive lists of all the subdivisions of said lands, to procure copies of all such township plats of the United States surveys of lands in this state, as he may deem necessary for the use of the state in carrying into effect all the provisions of this act.

SEC. 5. It shall be the duty of the governor to cause to be marked on such township plats or on a sectional map of the state which he is authorized to procure for that purpose, all the lands belonging to this state by virtue of said grants.

SEC. 6. There is hereby appropriated, out of any money in the treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of three thousand dollars, to be drawn from the treasury on the warrants of the governor as may be necessary to defray the expenses of carrying into effect the provisions and purposes of this act: *Provided*, The expenses of such surveys and expenses shall be re-imbursed to the treasury out of the first sales of such lands.

An Act to provide for the laying out of a certain State Road therein named.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Alvin Foster, Narcissa M. Juneau, and Mr. Stachinson, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road from the village of Juneau, in the county of Dodge, through the village of Horicon, Mayville, Theresa, Cranchville, Cascade, to the village of Sheboygan, in the county of Sheboygan:

*Provided*, That no part of the expense of laying out said road shall be paid out of the state treasury.

## Chap 496

An Act to amend chapter twenty of the Session Laws of 1849.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

Road districts.

SECTION 1. Those portions of the towns of Lake, Greenfield, Oak Creek, and Franklin, lying on each side of the town line which separates Greenfield, Lake, and Franklin from Oak Creek, extending one hundred and sixty rods on each side of said line from east to west and from north to south the whole length of the towns of Lake, Greenfield, and Oak Creek, and three hundred and twenty rods west of said line, in the town of Franklin, as far as said road extends, is hereby established, constituted, and divided into four road districts, to wit: one between the towns of Lake and Greenfield, and three between the towns of Oak Creek and Franklin.

Names of districts.

SEC. 2. The district in the towns of Lake and Greenfield shall be called Kilbourn road district number one; the first district in the towns of Oak Creek and Franklin, extending from the north line of said towns south two miles, shall be called Kilbourn road district number two; the second district, extending from the south line of district number two south two miles, shall be called Kilbourn road district number three; and the third district, extending from the south line of said towns of Franklin and Oak Creek north two miles, shall be called Kilbourn road district number four.

How overseers elected.

SEC. 3. The overseer of highways for said district shall be elected as provided in chapter twenty, section three, in the session laws of 1849.

Overseers to divide tools.

SEC. 4. The road overseers of said Kilbourn road districts number two, three, and four shall meet at some convenient place, and they shall divide the tools of said districts into three equal shares, and each of said districts number two, three, and four shall receive one share.

SEC. 5. All acts and parts of acts contravening the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.
